A Few Thoughts from Pastor

Can you name the "major festivals" of the Christian year? And by major festivals I mean those special events or times each year when the Church gathers to recall and celebrate some very important event in the life of Christ. Many have whittled the number of major festivals (times they "have to" go to church) down to only one or two, but historically there are actually thirteen (13) such festivals.

Thirteen? ... more than just Christmas and Easter? Let's see, maybe Good Friday and Ash Wednesday, that would be four; and then maybe that "Monday" (Maundy) Thursday thing during Holy Week, that would be five. I can't really think of any other special times that we have to (I mean "get to") go to church, and I'm still missing eight. Oh, I give up. Besides, does it really matter; don't I/we already go to church enough?

Well first of all, as you may have already noticed, some of the major festivals do actually fall on Sundays and so there aren't so-called special services for them. These would include Palm Sunday, Easter, Pentecost, and Trinity Sunday. Others, like Ash Wednesday, the Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Ascension (always on a Thursday, 40 days after Easter) never fall on Sunday. And Christmas and Epiphany (January 6) may or may not fall on a Sunday depending on the calendar for that particular year.

And there you have them, the thirteen major festivals of the Christian year. Collectively, they represent and highlight the life of Christ and His work here on earth for us. Gathering as Church to commemorate these special days/events keeps us anchored to Him as our source of life and hope, and unfortunately, "skipping" them in effect starves our faiths of the spiritual nourishment we need. It's sad that so many in the modern church are just too busy, too preoccupied, or too annoyed with someone or another to gather to celebrate and remember these important moments in the life of our Lord and Savior ... and yet they (we/I) find time for so many other far less important things. Lord, have mercy!

For a list of other feasts and festivals, see pages xi & following in the Lutheran Service Book. This continuing focus on the key days in the life of Christ reveals the Church's "obsession" (word used in only the most positive sense possible) with the person and work of Her Savior, Jesus Christ, for it is in Him, and Him alone, that we find hope and salvation. The things of this world will pass away, but He and His kingdom remain forever.

So why all this talk about festivals and such? Well, for one thing, I suspect we all need to be reminded from time to time to help keep our priorities straight. It can be quite easy to skip church (especially all those "extra" services) or to neglect Bible Study or daily devotions and prayer, and the more we do it (skip) the easier it (skipping) becomes. But make no mistake about it, we do so at our own peril. The faith that the Holy Spirit created in us is a living faith, and it needs care and nourishment, and when we neglect it, we run the risk of it becoming weak, sick, and perhaps even dying. We would never tolerate someone failing to feed a small child ... so why would we sometimes starve our faith, or allow our children to do so, by not taking advantage of every opportunity to gather to hear God's life-giving, faith preserving and strengthening Word? Lord, have mercy.

On the 29th of May, 40 days after Easter, we will join with the rest of the Church as She gathers to remember and celebrate our Lord's Ascension into heaven. This may be a "new" service for some of you, but it is entirely fitting that we pause from our "busy" lives to recall this important event. For those with conflicts on Sunday mornings, this is another opportunity to join your church family in worship, and for the rest of us it is yet another opportunity to receive the gifts Jesus died to give us. It is my sincere hope and prayer that all of you will join us for this "major festival" on the 29th!

Rooted in Christ, Growing in Stewardship

The heartland is now awash in various hues of green. The doldrums of winter give way to the colors of spring. Now, the promise of spring gives way to the growth of summer. Fields are planted and sprouted. Gardens are planted. Flowers adorn the beds of neighborhood homes and roadside ditches. Green is the shade of life!

Green growth is also the hue of the faithful steward. The seed of faith planted in human hearts in the waters of Holy Baptism grows as it is nurtured in the Word proclaimed and ingested in the Holy Supper. This faith does indeed save. But our stewardship of the Gospel is also designed to bear fruit for God's glory and the benefit of our neighbor.

To consider this, let us look at the hymn, "Fruitful Trees, the Spirits Sowing" (LSB 691). It is very much a stewardship hymn!

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's sowing, May we ripen and increase, Fruit to life eternal growing, rich in love and joy and peace.

The tree of faith is not planted in us by us. It is the Spirit's work! We do not claim the title "steward." Rather, we are created for it (Gen. 1:26–28).

He is the One who makes it grow in us. The fruits of the Spirit are borne out because we, by grace through faith, are connected to the vine that is Jesus (John 15).

Laden branches freely bearing Gifts the Giver loves to bless; Here is fruit that grows by sharing, Patience, kindness, gentleness.

Our stewardship is NOT about what we do. It is about what the Holy Spirit does in and through us. That is the fruit that we bear. His fruit for His purposes.

But that fruit is lived out through us. The world sees the fruit of our stewardship of the Gospel in lives lived connected to Word and Sacrament.

Rooted deep in Christ our Master, Christ our pattern and our goal, Teach us, as the years fly faster, Goodness, faith, and self-control.

Stewards have been created and redeemed to reflect the image of Jesus in the world. He is the pattern. We reflect to others around us the Light of the Gospel He has shone on us.

This reflection comes when Christ's goodness flows from us to others.

Fruitful trees, the Spirit's tending, May we grow till harvests cease; Till we taste, in life unending, Heaven's love and joy and peace.

Just as the Spirit has created us for stewardship of the Gospel, so also does He cause our faithfulness! He calls, gathers, enlightens, sanctifies and KEEPS us in this faithful stewardship of the Gospel.

The ultimate goal of our faithful stewardship is eternity. For us. For our neighbor. All worked out by the Spirit.

Green is the color of the world right now. It is also the color of our stewardship and it is growing in us as we are connected to the vine, Jesus! God grant our growth in Him!


