From the Pen of the Pastor

You Are Whose You Are

By the Grace of God I am what I am (1 Cor. 15:10)

These are the words of St. Paul, the believing child of God...the Apostle of the Risen Lord...an ardent laborer in the Lord's Kingdom....the powerful preacher to the Gentiles and the author of thirteen of Scriptures blessed Epistles. 'By the Grace of God,' indeed it was, for this man wasn't always a Saint...there was a time when he was one of the biggest bigots and most zealous persecutors of Christ's Church on earth. He even participated in the stoning of Stephen, the first martyred saint. He was then known as Saul.

Now Saul certainly was not a follower of Jesus. In fact, he didn't even know him before his crucifixion. The narrative of the Book of Acts suggests that Saul's conversion did not come about until four to seven years after Jesus was crucified. Saul described himself as "a Pharisee of Pharisees." In doing so he exposed some warts, for the Pharisees were the strictest of Jewish sects. Their failings include their reputation for clinging to their own laws and traditions instead of God's Law....their great hypocrisy...their higher concern with outer purity than in the purity of the heart...their vanity and craving of the best seats in social gatherings...and for praising God with their lips while their heart was far from Him.

But, by the Grace of God, Saul was converted. On the road to Syrian Damascus, after having secured for himself a mandate issued by the High Priest to seek out and arrest any followers of Jesus he could find, so they could be returned to Jerusalem for questioning and possible execution, Saul meets the Lord Jesus. In the third person narrative of Acts 9 we're told...

"As Saul neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" "Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked. "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied. "Now get up and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do."

As we might imagine, the men traveling with Saul stood there speechless; they heard the sound but did not see anyone. Saul got up from the ground, but when he opened his eyes he could see nothing. So they led him by the hand into Damascus. For three days he was blind, and did not eat or drink anything.

The account continues with a description of how Ananias of Damascus received a divine revelation instructing him to visit Saul at the house of Judas on the Street Called Straight and there lay hands on him to restore his sight. Although Ananias is reluctant, because of Saul's reputation for persecution, he obeys the divine command. He went to the house and placing his hands on Saul, he said, "Brother Saul, the Lord—Jesus, who appeared to you on the road as you were coming here—has sent me so that you may see again and be filled with the Holy Spirit." Immediately, something like scales fell from Saul's eyes, and he could see again. He got up and was baptized, and after taking some food, he regained his strength.

Converted by the Lord and Baptized in His name, Saul was changed into one of the Lord's most revered evangelists and apostles. Thereafter Saul, known also as Paul, became a preacher of the Gospel, a founder of Churches and Christ's tool to bring salvation to the Gentiles. Paul never tired of praising the God of Grace and Mercy and singing hymns of thanksgiving for the grace of God which made him, as terrible as he had been, a believing and loving disciple. With deep emotion Paul confesses of Jesus,

"He loved me and gave Himself for me" (Gal 2:20),

and to others he proclaimed the truth of his conversion, saying...

"I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel I preached is not of human origin. I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it; rather, I received it by revelation from Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my previous way of life in Judaism, how intensely I persecuted the church of God and tried to destroy it. ...But when God, who set me apart from my mother's womb and called me by his grace, was pleased to reveal his Son in me so that I might preach him among the Gentiles, my immediate response was not to consult any human being.

Dear Brothers and Sisters of this Lutheran Partnership of congregations, as we begin this New Year, may we all take time to rejoice in all that God can do; especially, in how He can take sinful human creatures like Saul, and you and me, and change us into the people He created us to be, so that we may do in and for His kingdom and people that which He created us to do. In 2022, may we all respond to God's goodness, and our conversion through Christ, as faithfully as Paul did, so that many more people, Jew and Gentile alike, may know the peace and salvation Christ wants all people to have.

White paraments are the color of "purity" and "completeness" and symbolize joyful celebration of the work of our Savior. In addition to their use during Eastertide, white is the appointed color for such festive Sundays as Christmas and its twelve days.

This includes Epiphany, the Baptism of our Lord, Transfiguration Sunday, and Trinity Sunday. White signifies important events throughout the church year.

Green paraments used during Epiphany and Pentecost seasons symbolize the spiritual growth God gives the church and to each believer and are by far the most common color seen during the church year. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of the Sundays during those two seasons. Green is considered a neutral color, but there is nothing colorless about our need to grow and mature as disciples of Jesus Christ. That's why the "green meadow" time of the church year is so lengthy.
