From the Pen of the Pastor

Dear Saints of the Northeast Kansas Lutheran Partnership,

Ever been asked, "How's everything in your world?

How do we answer that? Where do we start? How far back should we go to form an answer? Do we go all the way back to our last presidential election and comment on the controversies then existing over what votes were or weren't counted? Or do we just go back to our recent knee surgery? Or do we go as far back as the signing in of the new President, and his purportedly 'rash' undoing of many of the initiatives started by his predecessor... Or do we jump back to the recent death of a loved one? Or is it the Covid-19 pan-demic...and the question of how it really started and who really is to blame that draws our attention? ? Scripture provides a good example of this. One day, as Jesus and His disciples were crossing the Sea of Galilee in a boat, a great windstorm arose and the waves were breaking into the boat, so that the boat was already fill-ing... (Mark 4: 35-37) And isn't that the way it often goes? 'Without warning'...'suddenly'.... The sun is shin-ing one day and then the very next day, we see a sudden storm of sickness, family problems, financial turmoil, civil unrest, unemployment, underemployment, or a hundred other things, start breaking into our boats.

The waves of fear and doubt, and discouragement and despair can overwhelm us and make us feel like we are, if not capsizing, about to drown.

Maybe you have never felt any of this, if so I'm happy for you...just as happy for you as I am sad for the many people I have met and heard of who have or are facing what seems to them as almost insurmountable problems. For those who need help, Jesus steps in, saying:

"You of little faith, why are you so afraid." Then (we are told) He gets up, rebukes the wind and the waves, and it becomes completely calm.

The storms of this world are going to suddenly arise; but, God's love for you is greater than any storm. He will be with you, to comfort you and intervene as He sees fit. No matter what happens, He tells us,

"All things will work together for good for those who love God (Romans 8:28).

And we **do** love Him...and in Christ, have peace with Him (Romans 5:1).

Will the world's problems or our problems disappear? No. Will more storms come? Yes, almost certainly. But in Jesus Christ, we are safe. In Him, our sins are forgiven, and in Him, we have the assurance that God is with us always and that nothing...no virus, no vaccine, nor anything else "...can separate us from the love of God that is in Jesus Christ. (Romans 8:38-39)

How's your world today? It is blessed.



HYGIENE KITS

CONTENTS

- 1 bath towel
- 1 wash cloth
- 1 bath-size bar of soap
- 1 plastic soap box holder
- 1 toothbrush

- □ 1 sturdy comb
- □ 6 band-aids (½" or ¾")
- 1 small package facial tissues
- 1 nail clipper
- 1 piece of strong ribbon or cord

ASSEMBLY

- 1. Lay out the towel on a flat surface.
- 2. Fold over about 5" on each long side.
- 3. Place the rest of the items in the center under the folds.
- 4. Roll up the towel.
- 5. Use ribbon or cord to tie the towel together in the middle.

PLEASE NOTE

- Dark colored linens are recommended.
- We recommend leaving contents in the original packaging, but it is not required.
- No additions, deletions, or substitutions.
- Do not add money, photos, or personal notes.
- Do not include items with religious, camouflage, patriotic or military symbols.
- Pack only new or gently used items.
- Do not include plastic bags.
- It costs an average of \$11 to ship each box of kits. Please consider a donation to your local OGT branch to help with shipping.

Although well-meaning variations are tempting, please do not do this. It may result in heavy fines and/or the entire shipment being confiscated by customs officials.
