A Few Thoughts from Pastor

Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. Romans 13:1a

Well, how's that for a 4th of July word from the Lord? Wouldn't this be a better verse for April 15th, or for the day after the first Tuesday in November? Doesn't it kind of miss the point for a day set aside for celebrating freedom and independence, or are you wanting to take us back to the days of the pandemic?



Well, in the minds of some, especially those who don't really care what God says anyway, I suppose it might seem odd. But to those who actually care what God says, and I believe even for those who signed the original Declaration of Independence, it's not odd at all. Let me explain ...

In our day, and especially in our country, some not only celebrate freedom, liberty, and independence, they actually **worship** their own notions of what these words mean. To them these things mean they are free to think, say, and do whatever they want or whatever seems right to them.

But such unfettered personal liberty and freedom give rise to idolatry, where the will-of-self trumps God's holy will, and where tolerance and acceptance of foolish (and abominable) ideas and actions are touted as somehow synonymous with liberty and independence. When creatures choose to exercise their own wills in absence of the Creator's will, or even worse, in opposition to it, they set themselves up as false gods, claiming independence even as they actually serve the king of lies, Satan.

And while we celebrate our freedoms, may we always worship and praise God alone, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. To Him, and Him alone, be all glory, honor, and praise!

For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

Galatians 5:1

We celebrate this month because of the freedoms and liberties our country has afforded us. We are right to do this. We should be thankful for these liberties – the freedom to gather together to worship and to live out what we believe in our daily lives.

But freedom and liberty in our age have devolved. It has become a freedom from duty instead of a freedom for it. He calls us to live in faith toward Him and in fervent love for our neighbor. He calls us to put the gifts He gives to us in His service. God calls parents to provide for their children and raise them in the fear and admonition of the Lord.

And God calls children to honor their parents and provide and care for them when they are no longer able to do so themselves. God calls the government to punish those who do evil and to reward those who do good. He calls citizens to pay their taxes and honor the governing officials as God's servants. He calls pastors to preach and teach the Gospel, repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And He calls hearers to support those who teach them with every good thing.

Christ died to set us free from the works of our selfish flesh, giving us the freedom and liberty to do our duty. Stand firm, then, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery.

Sarah gave updates for the convention bus.


Evan briefed the group on VBS and had a snack sign up.
