Bishop Peter visited us as part of his Healing Mass tour of the diocese. It was great to, not only, be a part of the prayer teams, but also to spend time with him in the local coffee shop sharing stories and asking questions.

Our FOCUS Missionaries continue to be an integral part of our ministry through their weekly Bible Studies and discipleship formation of students to be active leaders in our faith. Our evangelization efforts on campus have included our highly successful lunches on Monday & Wednesday - thank you volunteers! Our FOCUS Missionaries were even invited to teach about Catholicism at the campus LDS Institute! Some of their students have also started coming to Mass!
