I want to tell you about 2 students who, Godwilling, will become fully initiated members of the Catholic Church next Easter. I'm omitting their names for their privacy.

Our first student joined us at the beginning of the Spring semester. We happened to encounter him out the front of St. John's as we were handing out hot chocolate. We invited him to come join us that night for our dinner & discussion. He arrived early with Bible in hand. Before the event, he told me about how he had been going to a local Bible church in Pocatello and had decided the previous day to attend their campus ministry. He had a negative experience and was refreshed by the openness of St. John's to embrace someone who may hold differing beliefs. He came to Mass that Sunday and, with 2 of our FOCUS missionaries, that Wednesday attended the other campus ministry again. It didn't get better the second time round, so much so that he went back to the leader and said "You might not have lead me to Catholicism but you've definitely driven me to St. John's." He has been coming to RCIA and all other St. John's activities ever since.

The second student I'd like to highlight is a Pocatello native, a freshman. Raised as a lapsed LDS, he found community in the Fall with another Christian group. They baptized him in Bear Lake in October. We hosted an ecumenical event in February which he, and his group, attended. This chance encounter

inspired this young man to research Catholicism. His appetite for Catholicism became so ardent that he started to show up to every event - lunches, dinners, Mass, bible study - to the point where we actually started a new event to engage him further. 'Inquiry' started in March because of his desire to ask questions about Catholicism More of our non-Catholic students have started to attend this group because the forum is simply oriented around 'What questions do you want to ask?' and discussion flows from that point.

We feel so fortunate to have these, and all our other students, striving to grow in faith. love, and community with the Lord & each other.
