In his book 'Victorian Days in a Devon Village,' A.H.Slee mentions the following:

"Every year the Oddfellows held a club walk and Fete. This was known all over North Devon as Braunton Revel. It was undoubtedly the liveliest day of the year, and crowds gathered from all parts of the neighbourhood. The afternoon was given up to sports in a field which was crowded with men, women and children who enjoyed the pleasures of a village fair. One part of the field was roped off for sports. There were open as well as local events and the champions of North Devon were often competitors. Climbing a greasy pole for a leg of mutton, tied on the top, was an attractive event."

In Picture Postcard Braunton by Bob Davis there are pictures of the Carnival in 1911 taken at Cross Tree under the boughs of the tree which gave the centre crossroads its name. The one shown below shows a crowd in their best attire and Edwardian style hats, most looking up at the photographer rather than the gaily decorated handcart to the left. Another shows the handcart with a Pierrot and the family business of A. Dennis Butcher and G. Tossell's Emporium.

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The Village Fair is held on Whitsun Holiday. Over the years it has changed and sadly no longer has a Carnival or a May Queen. Once that used to go from Wrafton Road, winding through Braunton to Saunton Rd Estate. In 1975 there were 23 floats, all lead by the May Queen and her attendants. Prizes were given for the best in several categories; in Trades, Adults, Children's and even Equestrian. Many took part, including Harveys Dairy's and the Round Table in Trades, whilst schools and Girl Guides and Scouts participated in the children's class. Floats were imaginative and names varied from 'Winter Wonder' to 'Day trip to Mars!'
