POLIO UPDATE

BREAKING NEWS...

At the time of going to print, the latest polio figures are as follows:

- 1 child paralysed by polio in Afghanistan and 1 child in Pakinstan (while the total number of 2020 cases remain 140).

On 29.03.21 the 2nd national polio immunisation campaign of 2021 was launched in Afghanistan, with the aim of targeting approx 9.9 million children under the age of 5 against polio during the 5-day campaign across the country. Α supplementary dose of vitamin A will also be administered to children aged 6 to 59 months during this campaign.

Anonymous Donation During Lockdown

With the opportunities for the Club to organise its usual fundraising events seriously curtailed due to the Covid pandemic, we like others, have found that our ability to support local charities similarly restricted. However, as a result of the publicity around locating unwanted laptops and tablets to support distance learning for pupils of local schools during the recent lockdown, the Rotary Club was contacted NDADA by a former resident of Braunton, now living abroad, who most generously wished to support our work.

We were greatly surprised (and extremely grateful) when the donor decided to send us £2,000 to help support those local charities which were themselves supporting the most deprived or vulnerable people during this very difficult and stressful time.

After discussion within the Club and with the donor, we decided to support four charities, giving each of them £500. The chosen charities the were South Street Braunton Food Bank (currently supporting 100 people), the Ilfracombe Foodbank, Encompass South West (which supports homeless people, especially those in more rural areas locally) and North Devon Against Domestic Abuse.



"We are said dealing with increased demand for support which is much more complex in nature than previously. We have not closed or reduced any of our support services but have found additional ways of delivering these thereby keeping women, children and families safe. The refuge has remained open with staff attending on a rota basis in order to with Covid-19 comply restrictions. Group work has continued using various



forms of media and this has been so successful that we have decided to retain this type of support alongside face to face work once the restrictions have lifted. In this way we are able to support higher numbers especially those who are more rurally located and without transport. This donation will be put towards the additional costs of delivering these services and will have a direct beneficial effect on the lives on those individuals in our community who are affected by domestic abuse."

All the funds were given to the charities very promptly, as their needs were (and still are) urgent.

Braunton Caen Rotary would like to express its sincere gratitude to the donor for helping to support this community in these difficult times, and to Rotarian Paul Cockcroft for leading on this initiative.

Covid Response

Braunton Academy - Covid Rapid Testing



We are delighted to have been able to support our local Braunton Academy with Covid Rapid Testing to enable the students to return to school. Each student was tested three times over a period of three weeks, which was a massive logistical exercise with 700 students ie 2,100 tests. The aim was to test the students quickly and efficiently with minimal disruption to their education. All volunteers completed a series of on-line training modules and visited the test centre in advance so they could see how it functioned, before starting the series of



sessions over a 3 week period. Our roles were as Test Assistants, encouraging and reassuring the students as they take their own swabs, and Test Processors. We would like to express our thanks to Val & Mark Cann, and to Jan Rolfe of Braunton Inner Wheel, for working with us.

All volunteers were delighted to receive an invitation to lunch at the Academy with members

of the school testing team later this month.

The Rotary Foundation

Since March 2020 Rotary's own

charity, The Rotary Foundation, has awarded \$32million in relief grants for Covid 19 related projects, worldwide. In total last year 1,359 grants were made totalling over \$95 million. This is double the amount of six years ago when the present global system was started.

Work on the refurbishment of the accommodation facilities at North Devon Hospice which is to commence in May, is an example of how Foundation monies are put to good use in local communities. The project was enabled by a District grant initiative led by Holsworthy club, to which we were very happy to contribute.

A 7th area of focus has recently been added i.e. Supporting the Environment. The other 6 areas are: Peacebuilding and conflict prevention; Disease prevention and treatment; Water, sanitation, and hygiene; Maternal and child health; Basic education and literacy; and community economic development.
