ANONYMITY STATEMENT

"Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio and films." Thus, we respectfully ask that when using digital media, A.A. members are responsible for their own anonymity and that of others. When we post, text, or blog, we should assume that we are publishing at the public level. When we break our anonymity in these forums, we may inadvertently break the anonymity of others.

WHAT IS WACYPAA?

WACYPAA was conceived at the 1996 ASCYPAA (Arizona State Conference of Young People in AA), and was later founded in Anaheim, California on September 8th, 1996 at the 39 ICYPAA (International Conference of Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous) in a meeting of AA members from around the region to be served by WACYPAA. At that meeting the region was defined as the states of: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming; as well as Baja California Norte, Baja California Sur, Chihuahua, Durango, Sinaloa, Sonora, and the Canadian Provinces of British Columbia, Yukon Territory, and Alberta. Since that time, our region definition has been broadened to include Kansas, Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota and Texas. Each year, the conference must be held within this region.

The purpose of WACYPAA is to build and strengthen unity in Young Peoples Groups in Alcoholics Anonymous in the western area of North America and Hawaii. The focus is especially to reach those areas which historically had little exposure to such conferences. The WACYPAA Advisory Council and the members of the Conference will encourage the participation from all states, provinces, and countries within the scope of the Conference. All bids will be given equal consideration regardless of size, population, or location. We recognize that not all AA members will find our conference necessary to their recovery from alcoholism, we seek only to provide it for those who find it desirable.

At the Anaheim meeting, the state of Arizona was tentatively chosen as the site for the first WACYPAA. The Arizona group was to present their bid in February 1997 at the All California Conference of Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous in San Francisco. Seven AA members volunteered to attend and serve as a temporary advisory council for the purpose of approving Arizona's bid, or to solicit further bids at a later date if the Arizona bid was not deemed to serve the best interests of the region. Once an initial site is chosen, a bid session will be held annually at each subsequent WACYPAA where a site will be chosen for the next year's conference. Any group of three or more AA members from within the region is welcome and encouraged to bid for a chance to host a WACYPAA in their local area.

Each year, AA conferences provide overwhelming evidence that large numbers of alcoholics are achieving a lasting and comfortable sobriety in Alcoholics Anonymous. These conferences offer an environment for celebration of our sobriety, as well as an opportunity to meet and share experience, strength, and hope with AA members who reside in areas other than their own.

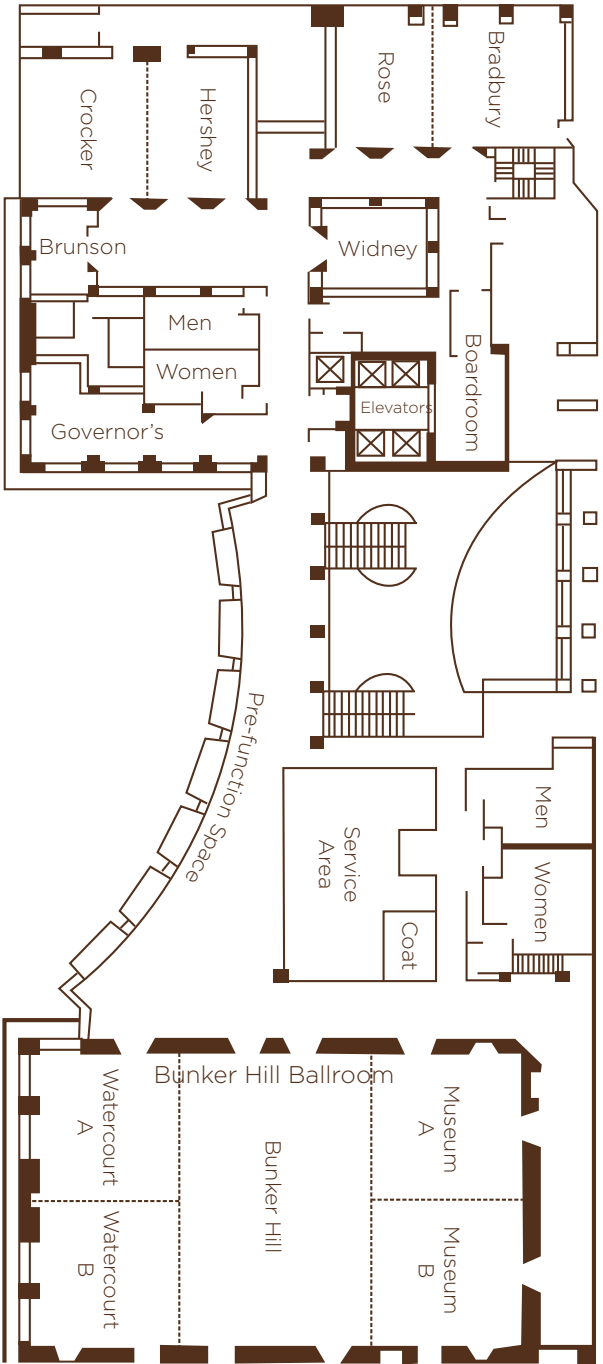

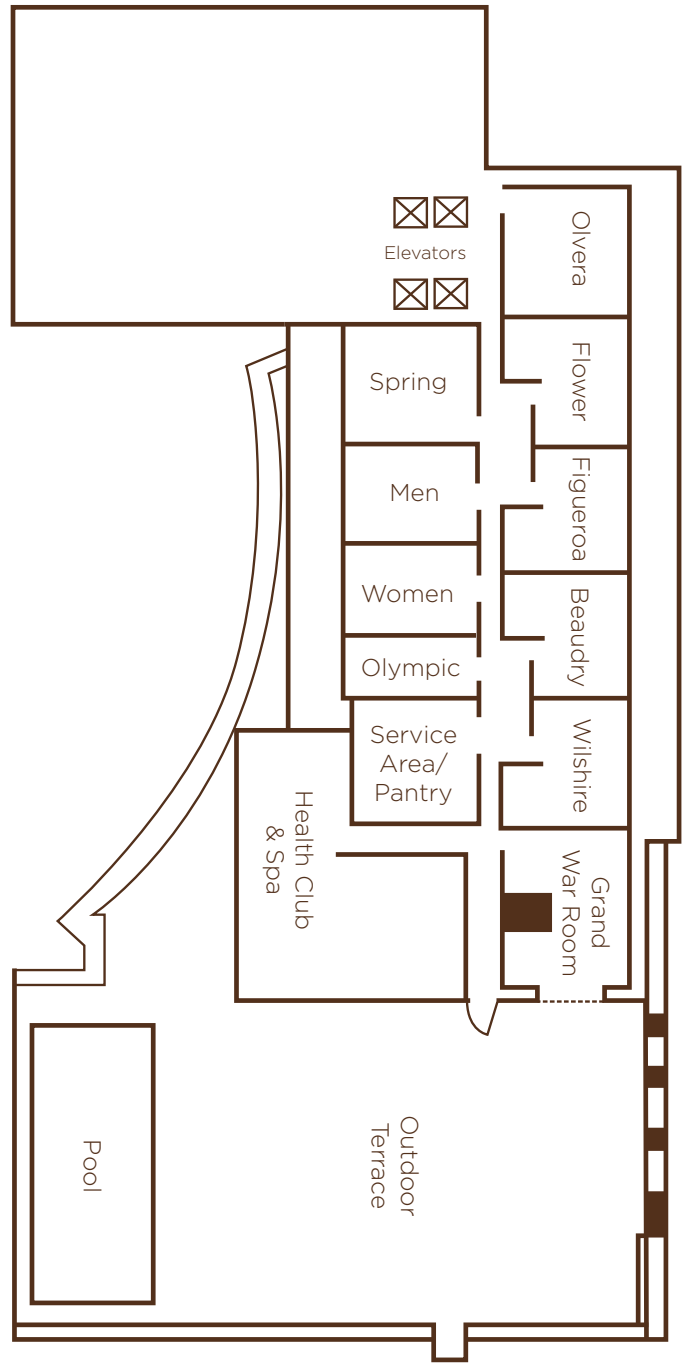

PARKING

Parking at the OMNI is \$15 per day- take your car in and out of the garage as much as you want and just mention you are with WACYPAA to get the discounted rate.

HOTEL POLICIES - Check in time is at 4:00PM. Check out time is 12:00PM. Quiet in common areas after 10:30PM. No outside food or beverages permitted in any break out rooms or meeting spaces. Parking at a discounted rate of \$15. Please check-in at the registration table for validation tickets.

PET POLICY - If you would like to bring your four-legged friend, you must have a valid credit card on file. Guests must sign a waiver at check-in before their pet is allowed in any guest room or public area. Keep in mind, only pets weighing 25 lbs. and under are permitted at Omni Los Angeles Hotel. Each room with a pet will be charged a non-refundable cleaning fee of \$100 per stay. When any one of our staff members enters the room, your pet must be placed in a carrier. In the event that your pet is the cause of guest complaints, the hotel will request that your pet seeks accommodations elsewhere. Service dogs are exempt from this policy.

SMOKING POLICY - For the health and comfort of all our guests, Omni Los Angeles Hotel at California Plaza is a non-smoking hotel. Guests may smoke 20 feet away from the front door and outside on the second and third floors. If a smoking violation occurs, the guest will be charged a fee of \$250 per incident.

TRANSPORTATION

TRAVEL TO AND FROM THE OMNI HOTEL

LAX TO OMNI

- FLYAWAY

Once you exit baggage claim, you should be on the Arrivals level. In front of each Arrival terminal there is a blue “LAX Flyaway” sign. Each Flyaway bus is marked with its service location. Take the “Union Station” Flyaway. You can buy your Flyaway ticket onboard the shuttle. It costs \$9.75 and they only take debit/credit card. Once you are at Union Station, either go to the “Rideshare” area and call an Uber/Lyft/Taxi to the Omni Hotel (1.2 miles); or take the Metro. You can either take the Red Line (North Hollywood) or Purple Line (Wilshire/Western). Take the metro one stop to “Civic Center/Grand Park” and exit on the “Hill & 1st Street Exit”. Once you exit, type Omni Hotel Los Angeles into your GPS and follow the walking directions (0.2 miles)

- UBER/LYFT/TAXI

If using Uber/Lyft, make your request as soon as you get your bag then go to the LAXit area. For a taxi, go directly to LAXit. LAXit is east of Terminal 1 and accessible via Sky Way. This system has only been in place since October and has a few hiccups. This transportation method is best for those that want to practice their 3rd Step and work on their patience.

OMNI TO LAX

- FLYAWAY

Either call an Uber/Lyft/Taxi at the hotel for Union Station or walk to the “Civic Center/Grand Park” metro stop. You can either take either the Red Line (Union Station/Downtown LA) or Purple Line (Union Station/Downtown LA) for one stop. Exit “Union Station” and go outside to the “Flyaway” area. Shuttles come every 30 minutes and it takes 30-45 minutes to get to the airport. You can buy your Flyaway ticket onboard the shuttle. It costs \$9.75 and they only take debit/credit card.

TRANSPORTATION (CON.)

- UBER/LYFT/TAXI
