Through our **WeCareEd** program, we pay school fees for children that are selected by a committee. The fees are paid starting with whatever grade the students are in and continue through Grade Seven.

Together with our supporters, we help people in some of the toughest places around Mutare in Zimbabwe, especially rural areas. Churches across the board are our major supporters and partners. We invite you and your church to be part of what
