## TikTok

We are aware that this

is a very popular app with some of our pupils and give below information and guidance given by internetmatters.org

### What is TikTok?

It's a social media app that allows users to share 60 second short videos with friends, family or anyone.

## What is the minimum age for TikTok app?

13 is the minimum age according to TikTok's terms and conditions.

### How does TikTok work?

When you download the app, you can instantly see the videos that others have posted on the channel but are not able to share or post anything until you have set up your own account. The account is automatically set to public so anyone on the app can see what the user shared and we strongly recommend that this is changed to private.

### Things to be aware of

Internetmatters.org have reported that parents expressed concerns around inappropriate language of some of the videos posted. Predators seeking to connect with children is another risk.

Not all accounts are genuine and could be set up by people pretending to be someone else and they could post hurtful or upsetting comments.

#### Reporting inappropriate content

You can report abuse, spam, or anything else that doesn't follow their Community Guidelines within the app. Click on the profile of the account you want to report, click on Settings and then Report.
