

### MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER





# **OUR PARTNERSHIPS**


Ocean Music Action collaborates with conservation organizations and presenters, using our concert platform to support and amplify their work.

#### The Bishop Museum

Ocean Music Action musicians Megan Conley, Shawn Conley, and guest artist Abe Lagrimas, Jr, performed for the opening of *Backyard Adventures*, an interactive science exhibit engaging guests with the wonders found in their own backyards. This exhibit serves to inspire the next generation of citizen scientists while emphasizing the importance of outdoor activity and exploration.

#### Buffalo Bayou Partnership

In collaboration with the Buffalo Bayou Partnership, Ocean Music Action organized an Earth Day weekend volunteer cleanup with Buffalo Bayou. Over 35 community members joined together to help revitalize the bayou, which flows through Houston and down to Galveston Bay.





#### Houston Museum of Natural Science

Ocean Music Action was proud to partner with the Museum for A Deep Dive: Octopus, Seahorse, Jellyfish with David Liittschwager. Liittschwager shared images and stories of his decades of experience photographing wildlife, answered questions, and signed copies of his book Octopus, Seahorse, Jellyfish, recently published by National Geographic.

#### Houston Arboretum & Nature Center

Ocean Music Action presented our first children's concert at the Arboretum. The program, Water in Harmony, included a nature-inspired chamber music performance, a water-quality lesson, hands-on art making, and pond-dipping, where children delighted in discovering the variety of life in a pond. We are thrilled to welcome Arboretum Senior Naturalist and Early Childhood Coordinator Patti Bonnin to Ocean Music Action as our new Education Advisor.

#### Mālama Maunalua

Megan Conley provided beautiful harp music for Malama Maunalua's screening of *Chasing Coral*, a documentary that details the massive coral bleaching events of 2014-2017 and serves as a call to action in defense of the world's ocean ecosystems.





#### Moody Center for the Arts at Rice University

On April 23, the Moody Center presented Ocean Music Action in an hour-long tapestry of music, art, and dance featuring live music performed alongside stunning ocean photography by National Geographic's David Liittschwager. The multidisciplinary showcase featured dancer Maile Okamura as well as works composed and performed by students from the Shepherd School of Music.

#### Rothko Chapel


Ocean Music Action presented our first public performance at the Rothko Chapel, in Houston Texas, over Earth Day weekend. This sold-out, al fresco concert took place in front of the Chapel reflecting pool, and featured ocean-inspired music by Takemitsu and Debussy, accompanied by dancer Maile Okamura. Artwork by conservation artist Janavi Mahimtura was on view, and plastic-free water was provided by HOW water company.

#### Usdan Summer Camp for the Arts


