Inspire

We curate and produce world class concert events, sharing new commissions and works from diverse artists, inspired by our connection to the ocean. We partner with well-known cultural and environmental organizations across the country to bring conservation to the forefront of audiences' minds. Post-concert, artists and audience join together in a volunteer activity designed to foster further engagement and connection to local conservation efforts.

Amplify

We also share our music on a more intimate scale with local organizations that are working toward our shared goals of sustainability and conservation. These projects amplify their critical work and use the power of music to connect with their audiences in a new way, growing a coalition of like-minded community members.

Educate

We focus on the vital younger members of our community with family-friendly community events. These projects inspire and educate the next generation of conservationists and aid in building a mighty community amongst our smallest citizens. We provide actionable next steps, connecting the dots to conservation action for audience members of all ages.



OUR PARTNERSHIPS

Ocean Music Action collaborates with conservation organizations and presenters, using our concert platform to support and amplify their work.

We Grow Hawaii

We Grow Hawaii is a student-led initiative with the goal of empowering youth on sustainable food advocacy. Ocean Music Action was invited to join the We Grow Food Summit at the Hawaii State Capitol on February 16th. Harpist Megan Conley performed as participants attended presentations, met with lawmakers, and enjoyed a lunch of locally-sourced ingredients.

East-West Center

Ocean Music Action musicians Megan and Shawn Conley performed for over 150 international students, sharing a program of ocean-inspired music paired with images by National Geographic photographer David Liittschwager, as part of the East-West Center program *The Exchange: Kinship and Reciprocity in a Changing World.* This concert was paired with a volunteer day in partnership with Malama Maunalua.





Houston Arboretum & Nature Center

This March, we continued our partnership with the Houston Arboretum, presenting *Harp and Hula*: an interactive family program of music from Hawaii. Families enjoyed nature-themed harp music, engaged in hands-on conservation-themed activities, and learned a traditional hula dance.

Waiau Elementary

Waiau Elementary School is a Title I suburban public school in Pearl City, Hawaii. It serves 473 students in Kindergarten through 6th grade. At the invitation of 4th grade teacher Kirstie Kane, Ocean Music Action founder Megan Conley visited Waiau Elementary, performing for over one hundred 3rd and 4th grade students. The program featured music inspired by Hawaii's local flora and fauna, and included discussion about how we can each do our part to protect these creatures and our waterways.

Surfrider San Diego

Ocean Music Action partnered with Surfrider San Diego for a beach cleanup on June Ist in conjuction with our concert at the Institute of Contemporary Art in Encinitas, California. Our volunteers helped remove 99 lbs of trash from Ocean Beach, including I 290 cigarette butts and 836 plastic fragments.





Foster Botanical Garden

Foster Botanical Garden is the oldest of the five botanical gardens in Hawaii. Together, these gardens represent the largest and most diverse tropical plant collection in the United States. This July, Ocean Music Action performed at the Garden's *Midsummer Night's Gleam*, an annual free event that opens the gardens with music, dance, activities, and educational booths promoting organic gardening techniques and sustainable water management.

Mālama Maunalua


Ocean Music Action is thrilled to continue our partnership with Malama Maunalua for the third year in a row, joining students from the University of Hawaii and East-West Center for a huki in March that resulted in the removal of 1500 lbs of invasive limu, followed by a second volunteer day in April in conjunction with our performance with Hanahau'oli School.

Yogarden

Yogarden's mission is to educate the community on the importance of growing our own food and living a healthy, sustainable lifestyle.

OMA performed at Yogarden Holiday Market for the second consecutive year, supporting Yogarden's work and mission through a performance of festive holiday music. This sustainably-focused holiday market featured local artisans, farm to plate food, holiday crafts, and a keiki craft station.
