Participants will become much more knowledgeable and comfortable with restorative practices and school climate content and able to return to schools and facilitate topics introduced in Basic Restorative Practices training to colleagues and other community members.

After the successful completion of Advanced Training, participants are provided with all materials necessary for such in-school training in all of the topics covered in Basic Restorative Practices training.
