RECOMMENDED PREREQUISITE:

One-Day Restorative Conferencing Training (Offered at CAS on June 5)

This five-day professional development training session can only be taken after the successful completion of School Climate Basic Training. Advanced Training is an "extension" of School Climate Basic Training. In this session participants dig deeper into the topics that are covered in the two-day Basic training session, to allow everyone to gain a much richer understanding of the content central to school climate improvement and the imperative to focus on this important work as a primary "driver" for student and school success, both academic and social/behavioral.

In addition, participants receive information about different learning styles as well as how to facilitate training for adults. As with Basic training, Advanced Training is highly interactive.

There are two overarching goals for Advanced Training:

- To be much more knowledgeable and comfortable with school climate "content"
- To be able to return to their schools/organizations and share/facilitate topics introduced in Basic training to colleagues and other community members

After the successful completion of Advanced Training, participants are provided with all materials necessary for such in-school training in all of the topics covered in Basic training.
