

Restorative Classroom Job Ideas

- **Greeter:** Welcomes classmates and visitors with a smile, handshake, or high-five to help everyone start the day with a sense of belonging.
- **Encourager:** Shares kind words, notices positive choices, and reminds others of their strengths when challenges come up.
- **Peacekeeper:** Helps classmates use calming strategies, the peace path, or sentence stems to work out small conflicts respectfully.
- **Community Helper:** Looks for ways to support the whole class, including passing out materials, tidying up, or lending a hand when someone needs it.
- **Restoration Buddy:** Supports classmates in making things right if harm is caused, including helping with apology notes, clean-up, or brainstorming ways to repair.
- **Team Builder:** Leads or suggests quick team-building activities, games, or energizers that strengthen class connections.
- **Gratitude Collector:** Gathers thank-yous, shout-outs, or appreciations from classmates and shares them during circle or closing time.
- **Affirmation Teller:** Shares a positive affirmation during morning circle each day.
- **Circle Keeper Assistant:** Helps prepare the talking piece, circle guidelines, and opening/closing check-in questions for class circles.
- **Social Contract Keeper:** Reminds peers of the class agreements (social contract) in a positive way, like pointing to the chart or giving gentle reminders when needed.
- **Relationship Builder:** Makes sure no one is left out during transitions, group work, or recess - offering inclusion and kindness.
- **Restoration Helper:** Assists peers in repairing small classroom harms (e.g., helping reset supplies, apologizing with a note card station, or brainstorming “fix-it” options).

Restorative Classroom Job Ideas

- **Reflection Buddy:** Supports classmates who may need help completing a reflection sheet or calming strategy, sitting alongside them with empathy.
- **Peace Path Guide:** Walks peers through the classroom “peace path” (or conflict resolution chart) step by step, if both students agree.
- **Community Voice Representative:** Brings student ideas, concerns, or feedback to class meetings or suggestion boxes. Makes sure everyone’s voice gets heard.
- **Question Creator:** Generates circle prompts or morning circle questions (academic, fun, or reflective), giving students a role in shaping discussions.
- **Celebration Captain:** Leads positive shout-outs, gratitude moments, or affirmations during community time.
- **Welcome Ambassador:** Greets students at the door, offers a smile or high five, and helps guests/new students feel part of the community.
- **Calm Space Manager:** Keeps the “calm-down corner” stocked with tools (fidgets, journals, timers) and explains how to use it respectfully.
- **Harmony Helper:** Ensures materials are set up in ways that support fairness and equity (e.g., distributing supplies, rotating roles, ensuring all voices are included in small groups).
