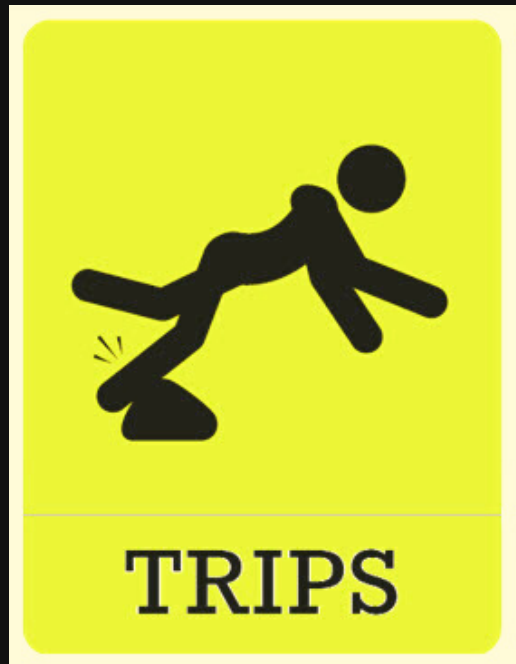


**FALLS**

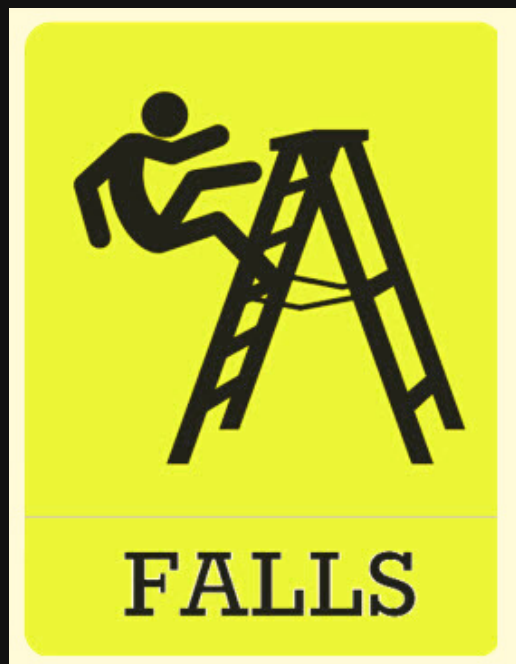
- Can occur in any part of the workplace whether inside or outside
- May result in serious injuries
- Significant cost to both the worker and employer



**SLIPS**: Occurs when there is too little friction or traction between your feet and the walking surface, and you lose your balance



**TRIPS**: Occurs when you are too far off your center of balance due to catching your foot on something.



**FALLS**: Occurs when you move downwards, typically rapidly and freely without control, from a higher to lower level

# Common Causes...

## SLIPS:

- Wet or oily surfaces
- Occasional spills
- Weather hazards
- Loose, unanchored mats
- Flooring or other walking surfaces that do not have same degree of traction in all areas

## TRIPS:

- Obstructed view
- Poor lighting
- Clutter in your walking way
- Wrinkled mats
- Uncovered cables
- Uneven walking surfaces



FALLS: Falls can be a result of both slips and trips. But additionally can occur when ladders or stepping stools are not maintained properly

# Prevention...

- Clean up spills immediately
- Wear proper shoes (specifically, non-slip shoes)
- Place wet floor signs
- Use mats in areas prone to water or grease spills
- Announce "corner" when coming around a blind corner
- Keep items secure, to reduce obstructions in walkway
