

Supply List

- ☐ Hat with a sun brim
- ☐ Sturdy shoes
- ☐ Extra sweater, wind cheater, or nylon rain jacket to keep in car for use as needed
- ☐ Bug repellent
- ☐ Water
- ☐ Wet wipes for your hands can be useful & convenient.
- ☐ Paper towels
- ☐ Painting knife, for mixing as well as painting
- ☐ Medium & “palette cup” with lid - Galkyd Lite. It begins to dry fast outside in the wind and air, so I usually add 10% oil. Graham walnut/alkyd medium is also good, and dries more slowly.
- ☐ Solvent & small cup
- ☐ Cloth rag

Painting supplies:

- ☐ Two small panels, maybe around 8x10
- ☐ Wood or paper palette (pre laid out when possible)
- ☐ Bristle brushes, a few flats & rounds sizes 2 through 8
- ☐ Soft, synthetic brushes, a couple will do, one of which is a small soft round
- ☐ Hardware store cheap bristle “chip” brushes- 1/2” and 1”
- ☐ painting knife
- ☐ Easel of choice
- ☐ paper towels & rag
- ☐ medium & solvent
- ☐ Paint box to hold it all
- ☐ Basic Paint:
Red, Blue, Yellow, White.-For example: Quinacridone red, Ultramarine blue, and Cadmium yellow light, White.
- ☐ Extended Basic Paint (could include) :
Red, Violet, Blue, Green, Yellow, Orange.For example: Quinacridone red, Quinacridone purple or violet, Ultramarine blue, Viridian (PG18) or Pthalo Green (PG7), Cadmium yellow light, Winsor Orange (PO72). And White.
