Three winners will be announced at the event. One first place prize of \$100 to be awarded; two runner-up prizes of \$50 to be awarded at the event.

Submission deadline: midnight August 1, 2025. There is no entry fee. Limit one poem per person.

Submission guidelines: Central to the poem theme must be an item of chocolate or other food. File attachment of poem must be a Microsoft Word (.DOCX) file, one page only. No contact info should appear on your poem page.

Email Subject line must include: "Eat Your Words: Chocolate & Poetry" (without it attachments will not be opened).
