- An accredited, four-year, non-traditional educational center (NTEC) serving K-12 students
- Offers high school transcripts, Fully Accredited by the Georgia Accrediting Commission
- Located in Cherokee County School District, an economically and ethnically diverse community within the greater metropolitan Atlanta area: 21% Hispanic, 7% Black, 65% White, 12% Asian
- Founded in 2005; first graduating class in 2006

To help young people discover their calling, develop their gifts, and determine their goals through a mentoring program emphasizing academic training, vocational exploration, and community service.


ON-CAMPUS CLASSES

- Classes are organized on a hybrid model: 50-minute classes, twice per week, 6 credits per semester
- No AP courses are offered on campus and limited Honors classes are offered from the 2017–18 school year to the 2023–24 school year.
- Dual enrollment is available but access may be limited by transport, scheduling, & fees.


PARENT-DIRECTED STUDIES

- Under Compass Prep's guidance and within Compass Prep's college preparatory framework, parents select and direct students' high school courses; coursework quality and rigor are assessed and monitored by Compass Prep which provides a transcript which is fully accredited by the Georgia Accrediting Commission.
- Motivated and advanced students are able to access
 academically rigorous courses, such as AP courses, courses
 beyond AP courses (e.g., college-level mathematics), and
 dual-enrolled courses in-person in metro Atlanta through
 qualified tutors and such organizations as Metro Academic
 Studies, Kennesaw State University, and Chattahoochee
 Tech; these courses are also available online through
 organizations such as Johns Hopkins Center for Talented
 Youth, Pennsylvania Home Schoolers, GA Virtual
 Academy. Ability to access these advanced courses may be
 limited by cost, scheduling, course availability, and
 transport.
- For AP courses, Compass Prep will accredit AP courses on a high school student's transcript for which the syllabus of the AP teacher is College-Board approved, and for which the student completes all coursework on that syllabus.
- For courses beyond AP (such as those taken through Johns Hopkins Center for Youth, for example) or dualenrollment courses, Compass Prep requests transcripts from those schools and incorporates the courses and grades into the calculated GPA on the Compass Prep transcript.

GRADING & GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 23 credit minimum in order to graduate
- English: 4 credits
- Math: 4 credits
- Science: 4 credits
- Social Studies: 3 credits
- Foreign Language: 2 credits
- Health & PE: 1 credit
- Electives: 5

- Semester-based
- Computed on a 4.0 scale
- 1.0 extra quality points are given for AP courses, courses beyond AP, and 3-4 Dual Enrollment courses in one semester.
- 0.5 extra quality points given for Honors courses (based on evaluation of course requirements) and 1-2
 Dual Enrollment courses in one semester.
- Numeric grades on the transcript are actual grades earned by the student: extra quality points are only reflected in the overall weighted GPA on the transcript.
- GPA calculations include all courses on the transcript
- Grading Scale: A= 90-100; B= 80-89; C=70=79; D= 60-69

CLASS RANK

Given the unique individualized course of study, Compass awards 1 Valedictorian and 1 Salutitorian per year based on Weighted GPA. Compass Prep does not rank.
