





Maintenance Checklist



Get on Top of Roof Problems

Inspect your roof from top to bottom. Check ridge shingles for cracks and wind damage. Look for damage to metal flashing in valleys and around vents and chimneys. Scan the roof for missing, misshapen, or damaged shingles. Look in your gutters for accumulations of granules. Finally, make sure your gutters are flowing normally.



Freshen Your Filter

Furnace filters trap dust that would otherwise be deposited on your furniture, woodwork, and so on. It's important to replace them regularly to make your unit fully functional and not drastically raise your utility bills.

Follow the package instructions to prepare and bake the cake mix for 24 cupcakes, then allow the cupcakes to cool thoroughly.

CAKE

1 package yellow cake mix

4 medium tart apples (peeled and finely chopped)

> 2 tablespoons butter

3/4 cup brown sugar (packed)

1 tablespoon cornstarch

1 tablespoon water

FROSTING

3 cups powdered sugar

1 cup butter (softened)

2 tablespoons heavy whipped cream

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 ½ teaspoons ground cinnamon

Optional: Thinly sliced apples for topping

TWO

On medium heat, melt butter in a large skillet. Add apples and brown sugar, and stir them together until the apples become tender, about 10-12 minutes. In a separate small bowl, create a smooth mixture by combining cornstarch and water, then incorporate it into the skillet. Let it come to a boil and continue stirring until the mixture thickens, which typically takes 1-2 minutes. Once thickened, remove the skillet from the heat and allow it to cool completely.

THREE

Utilizing a paring knife, carefully cut a 1-inchwide cone-shaped piece from the top of each cupcake, then dispose of the cut-out portion. Proceed to fill the resulting cavity with the prepared apple mixture.

FOUR

In a large bowl, mix together the five frosting ingredients until you achieve a smooth texture. Proceed to frost the cupcakes with the prepared frosting. Optionally, you can add apple slices on top for an attractive presentation when serving.

SLOW COOKER RED WINE PASTA



4-5 pounds bone-in beef short ribs salt and pepper 3 slices thick-cut bacon (diced) 1 1/4 cups dry red wine ½ cup low-sodium beef broth 2. 28-ounce cans crushed tomatoes 1, 6-ounce can tomato paste 1 medium vellow onion (chopped) 6 cloves garlic (finely minced) 3 ribs celery (finely chopped) 1 carrot (finely chopped) 1 tablespoon dried thyme 1 teaspoon dried sage 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes 8 tablespoons salted butter ½ cup fresh grated parmesan cheese (save the rind) 1 pound dry tagliatelle pasta 8 ounces burrata cheese (room temperature)

Begin by seasoning the short ribs with a pinch of salt and pepper. In a large skillet over medium heat, cook the bacon until it turns crisp, about 5 minutes. Afterward, carefully remove the bacon from the skillet. If there happens to be an excess amount of bacon grease, simply drain it off, leaving about 1 tablespoon in the skillet. Proceed to add the seasoned short ribs to the skillet and sear them on both sides until a brown crust forms. Once done, take the seared ribs out of the skillet and transfer them. along with the cooked bacon, to the slow cooker.

Add the parmesan rind, wine, broth, crushed tomatoes, tomato paste, chopped onion, minced garlic, finely chopped celery, diced carrot, thyme, sage, red pepper flakes, 4 tablespoons of butter, to the slow cooker and season to taste with salt and pepper. Cover and let cook on low heat for 6-8 hours.

After cooking, cool the short ribs briefly, then shred the meat, discarding bones, parmesan rind, and thyme. Mix shredded meat and parmesan with the sauce, keeping it warm.

In a large pot, bring salted water to a boil. Cook the pasta following the package instructions until it reaches an al dente texture. Drain the pasta and toss it with 4 tablespoons of butter.

Plate the pasta evenly among dishes, then add the ragu and mix thoroughly. Finally, garnish each serving with burrata and extra parmesan on top and enjoy!

This timeless and comforting recipe is the perfect slow-cooked Sunday dinner. It offers a hearty and delightful meal to savor after a busy day, and the best thing is that it's effortless to prepare and pleasing to everyone's taste buds!


market. Additionally, higher construction costs, labor shortages, and challenges in securing suitable land can limit the number of new homes that can be built.



1) Remove the core from the apple and cut it into small chunks. Slice the lemon and orange into thin wheels, discarding the ends. Combine all the prepared fruit in a 2.5-quart pitcher.

- 2) Pour the apple cider, ginger ale, whiskey, and lemon juice into the pitcher, then mix together with a long wooden spoon until well combined.
- 3) Place the punch in the refrigerator for a minimum of 1 hour, allowing the flavors to blend and meld together.
- 4) Fill each glass with the prepared punch, then add a few apple pieces and a fruit slice using a spoon. For a delightful touch during the fall and winter months, consider adding a cinnamon stick as a garnish.

FOR NON-ALCOHOL APPLE CIDER PUNCH

Add an additional ½ cup of ginger ale, ½ cup of cider, and 1/3 cup of lemon juice.
