

# Survey of Likely Voters Statewide in Oregon

*Crosstab Report – June 28, 2020*

Clout Research conducted a telephone survey of likely General Election voters statewide in Oregon regarding political races and issues. The survey was conducted June 24-28, 2020 and included 824 respondents in both landline and mobile phone-only households. The survey carries a confidence interval of 95% and a margin of error of +/- 3.41 percentage points.
