- Had a time of learning about strongly held traditions (or sacred cows) in churches, including worship time, worship style, role of pastor, and others.
- Approved the minutes of the 11/14/19 Session meeting.
- Heard about worship plans for the balance of 2019 and a planned Communion on 1/5/20.
- Heard from the Care Team for Ministry of Compassion that gifts for homebound members will be distributed by Edith Burdis, Mary Lou Trogolo, and a few Session members.
- Heard from the Care Team for Staff Support about church office holidays scheduled for 2020.
- Heard that Don Barnes will lead a team to work on the church website and that the Clerk will
 write a note to Rachael Pritz to thank her for her assistance in administering the New Hope website over the past year.
- Approved a budget totaling \$178,111 for 2020.
- Heard a report on training, examination, and installation of ruling elders elected in the class of 2022 (J. Cherepko, C. Shirey, and W. Siebert).
- Decided on assignments of elders for Care Teams and Committees in 2020.
- Called Part 1 of the 2020 Annual Meeting of the Congregation/ Corporation immediately after worship on 2/16/20 for the purposes of receiving annual reports for 2019, hearing a report on the Session-adopted 2020 budget, and conducting other business as appropriate.
- Thanked Paula McFarlane for her years of serving on the Session and for several years as our liaison with NCAA/Norwin Little League.
- Thanked John Simpson for his pastoral leadership as our bridge pastor and Session moderator for the past two years.
- Scheduled the next monthly Session meeting for 1/9/20.
