Friends in Our Lord Jesus Christ -

Even as I write this, the temperature is 67 degrees and the air is filled with the fragrance of spring. This is a humbling place to be because we must set aside what we think should be happening and what we think is "right" in a situation, and simply trust Him. Recently, I was visiting with someone whose life on earth was coming to an end. His words of wisdom to me were these: "Sometimes when things appear to be falling apart, they are actually falling in place." As his body was failing and falling apart, he knew that his eternal life was falling into place. What faith! What trust!

Paul tells the Philippians not to be anxious about anything (Philippians 4:6). Matthew writes that we should not worry about tomorrow because today has enough trouble (Matthew 6:34). Both write that we, as Christians, should not overly concern ourselves and obsess about what is going "wrong" because there is no need to worry when we truly trust that Christ is working all things for the good of those who love Him, who are called according to His purpose (Romans 8:28).

Here are some other ways to hear that we need to trust God:

- 1. Breathe. Have faith. Everything will be fine!
- 2. My child you worry too much. I've got this, remember? Love, God
- 3. Don't worry about tomorrow Christ has already been there.
- 4. And, in the words of Bobby McFerrin, "Don't worry be happy! In every life you will have trouble and when you worry you make it double!"

Winston Churchill, Prime Minister of England during World War II, said to "Keep calm and trust no one." I say, "Keep calm and trust God."

Friends, you may not understand everything that is happening in your life. You may even be very confused by circumstances, but find joy in all that occurs because then we honor the Lord Almighty.

As a ministry of Jesus Christ, Light of Life has a Christian commitment to provide a home for the homeless and food for the hungry, and will build disciples for the Kingdom of God among the poor, addicted, abused, and needy.

Light of Life has a Men's Residential Program, a Woman and Children's Program, and a Food and Emergency Program.

Men: Are provided shelter and training for employment. Light of Life offers men the opportunity to be in a healing, Christ-centered community while taking personal responsibility for their choices in the past and future.

Women: Through case management and counseling, women at Light of Life are empowered not only to achieve good health and self-sufficiency, but also the tools to grow in their careers, relationships and spiritual walks.

Children: Light of Life provides a nurturing environment for children to sleep, learn, play, and receive meals during their mothers' classes.

Chapel Ministry is held both mornings and evenings on a daily basis.

We will be collecting new, short, collapsible umbrellas during the month of February (Totes, etc.) for the Light of Life Rescue Mission
