Stewardship. The word always makes our eyes roll... But did you know that stewardship theory is a scientific framework that describes how people are motivated to work (or give their all) for a specific organization?

It is based on the idea that people are more likely to act in the best interests of an organization (like New Hope Presbyterian Church) than in their own self-interest. The theory says that those who give, when left on their own, will act as responsible stewards of the assets and resources of the organization.

In other words - you, as a member of the New Hope family, will do what is in the best interest of the family. The theorists (Donaldson and Davis, 1989) assume that given a choice between self-serving behavior and pro-congregation behavior, you will place higher value on cooperation within the congregation family.

There are five (5) parts of the theory (and I've put them in "church" terms so we understand the theory as related to New Hope), as follows:

- Trust we trust that the Lord Jesus Christ is our shared interest the person and work of Jesus must be our shared goal.
- Intrinsic motivation we trust that our motivation is not personal, but rather spiritually connected. Our motivation for giving and serving is Jesus himself, and we get our satisfaction from that knowledge.
- Collective mindset we work for the good of Jesus Christ, not for ourselves. That means we serve others before we serve ourselves.
- Long-term perspective we trust that our long-term perspective is Kingdom related. We work without interference because we are working with Christ to grow the Kingdom of God.
- Governance we are all priests in the Kingdom, and we are empowered by Jesus to give and work for the deepest concerns of the Kingdom of God.

Friends, as we begin our fall "stewardship" thoughts, I know that we all trust and have the collective mindset (and governance) that our Lord Jesus Christ is already active and working, and we but join him in his work here on earth. We have the long-term perspective to work until Jesus comes back. But I cannot tell you what YOUR motivation is. I know that spiritually, we are connected and we are generous — but your personal motivation must be determined by you through prayer and understanding what God wants of you.

It was queued up perfectly for my trip to a native plant fall sale in Pittsburgh on Saturday. I picked up an assortment of plants and some ground cover starters (wild strawberry). Those are in addition to a transplanted native from

landscaping at home and some seeds harvested from another native plant doing well in our yard.

Norwin Landscape Supply donated mulch. With Erin's help, we took the blank canvas left by Donna's crew and planted and mulched. Hopefully all the plants weather the winter and we start seeing a beautiful display next year with less maintenance.

All the purchased plants had plant stakes which I put in too so we have a sense where to expect most of what next year.
