

My discipleship journey started as early as the age of 7. It was a hot summer day; we had just moved to a new neighborhood where I had no friends. I was bored and wandering around the house and my mother was exasperated with me. She told me to a get a book and start reading, so I grabbed – of all books – the Bible. It was the King James Version so it was a bit cumbersome reading, and I kept going to my mother to ask her how to pronounce some of the words (more exasperation...). I read the whole Bible – not understanding ANYTHING – but I couldn't stop. I remember clearly her trying to tell me how to pronounce Ephraim and Manasseh. She wasn't certain either.

At that time, I was voracious, trying to understand and gain knowledge of God. I couldn't get enough. That continued until I was 9

when we joined the Presbyterian church in our neighborhood, and you all know the rest... I'm here, called by God as Minister and someone to walk with you on your discipleship journey.

The deep hunger for God should be our number one priority – our only "work" before other work. Otherwise, our discipleship is shallow. On the surface, all looks well but underneath are cracks, and we keep them hidden. The process of growing our faith is raw, messy, and difficult.

This Lent, let us all be looking for that voraciousness in our discipleship by cultivating a deep, personal relationship with Jesus; relying on Jesus to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Him. There will be many opportunities:

- A 40-day Lenten devotional booklet will be available;
- The Mid-Week Lenten worship services will start on Ash Wednesday and continue on Wednesdays through Holy Week, with lunch and fellowship afterwards:
- Sunday services will include some special ways to "see" Jesus at work in and through us.

But if these things don't help you grow in your love of God, then try a new spiritual discipline. Richard Foster says this about spiritual disciplines in his book "Celebration of Discipline": Disciplines allow us to place ourselves before God so that He can transform us. The disciplines are a gift from God as a means of receiving God's grace and being transformed into Christ-likeness. There are many disciplines but here are just a few: meditation, prayer, fasting, study, simplicity, solitude, submission, service, confession, worship, guidance, and celebration.

May we all grow – have deep spiritual transformation – as we continue together on this discipleship journey.

STEWARDSHIP IS MORE THAN MONEY

Remember that all we have belongs to God and we need to be responsible in managing them.

Hints for the month of March from the Care Team for Financial Stewardship

This is a good time to:

Money

- File your taxes early. Decrease the chance of identity theft. False submittals occur often.
- Buy generic. Many are just as good as the name brands.

Home

- Perform an energy audit to ensure your home is efficient as possible.
- Clean shower heads.
- Organize your junk drawer(s).
- Delve into the freezer, dig deep and rediscover what you've stored in the freezer.
- Clean the shower head. If a shower head is sluggish and no longer sprays evenly, it's probably clogged with mineral deposits. Soak them away with a solution of halfvinegar, half-water. Vinegar is acidic, and with prolonged contact, it can eat into metallic finishes, so don't soak the shower head for longer than 30 minutes. Rinse thoroughly and dry with a soft cloth.

Health

- Remember to schedule a leisure time for yourself, both physical and mental. Relaxation of mind and body is beneficial to your health.
- Cut your meal portions.
- Sip water while you sit.
- Start your day off with breakfast.
- March is national nutrition month: make half of your plate fruits and vegetables, drink more water, and reduce added sugars. A small handful of nuts or seeds can be a satisfying and healthy snack. look for unsalted or lightly salted nuts such as, almonds, hazelnuts, peanuts, and pecans.

Environment

 Spring is approaching. Take care of your lawnmower maintenance before cutting season.

- Start your garden seedlings so that the plants are big and healthy when planted.
- Be mindful of water and electricity usage.
- Taking shorter showers will lower your water and heating bill.
- Installing faucet aerators throughout your home can help conserve heat and water, without compromising water pressure.

Craft & Vendor Show


