Did you know that the favorite Christmas carol – the 12 Days of Christmas – is really about our faith? Apparently, the song was a "key" to teach (catechism) children so they remember important facts about our faith, the Bible, and what we believe. The listing that follows here are the words of the song and their true meaning.

The "True Love" in the song is not a girlfriend or boy-friend but rather Jesus Christ, born on Christmas Day.

The partridge in the pear tree also represents Him because that bird is willing to sacrifice its life to protect its young by feigning injury to draw away predators.

The two turtle doves are the Old and New Testaments of God's Word.

The three French hens represent faith, hope, and love.

The four calling birds are the four gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The five golden rings represent the first five books of the Old Testament, which describe humanity's fall into sin and the great love of God in sending a Savior.

The six geese a-laying signify the six days of creation.

Seven swans a-swimming demonstrate the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit: Prophecy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

The eight maids a-milking are the eight Beatitudes.

Nine ladies dancing are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, Self-control.

The ten lords a-leaping signify the Ten Commandments.

The eleven pipers piping represent the eleven faithful Apostles.

The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in The Apostles' Creed, the statement of what we truly believe as all Christians, regardless of our faith tradition.

Friends – May you all come to know the hope of this time of year!

PILL BOTTLE DONATIONS



In the past, New Hope has donated pill bottles as a mission project to support Matthew 25 Ministries. We will be collecting pill bottles again.

Matthew 25 Ministries accepts these donations for inclusion in shipments of medical supplies and for shredding and recycling. Our pill bottle program fulfills the dual needs of improving medical care in developing countries and caring for our environment.

Acceptable collection items include:

Prescription and over-the-counter pill bottles Large and small pill bottles, with or without child-resistant caps

Bottles included in shipments of medical supplies must have an all plastic lid.

Remove labels, leaving no glue or residue. Wash bottles in very hot water and dish soap.

Rinse and dry thoroughly.

Replace lids on clean, dried bottles.

Place clean, recapped bottles in large ziplock bags marked "Clean Bottles" and bring to the church narthex. These will then be blended with medical supplies.
