Dear New Hope Friends and Family,

For a couple of weeks now, a 3x5 card has been sitting on my desk in my study at home. It contains this verse of scripture:

"Eyes have not seen, nor have ears heard, nor has any human mind imagined the good things that God has for those who love him."

1 Corinthians 2:9

Often when I walk by my desk, I read that verse because I find it so encouraging. My ultimate goal is to memorize it so that I will have its encouraging words with me wherever I go.

I find this passage so encouraging because I don't think that Paul is just talking about what God has prepared for us in heaven (although that is certainly a part of it).
