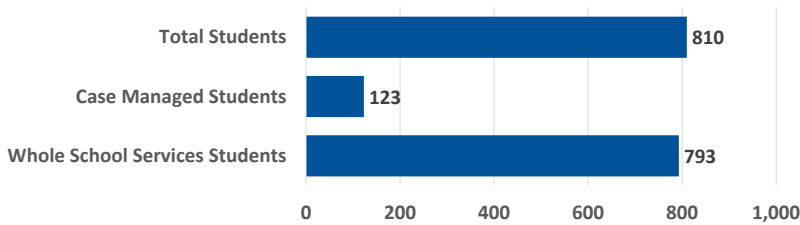


Communities In Schools (CIS) of Rome-Floyd County

We use a proven evidence-based model to help students stay in school.



Services are offered in 10 areas.

- Academic assistance
- Basic needs and resources
- Behavior
- College, career preparation
- Community service
- Enrichment, motivation
- Family engagement
- Life and social skills
- Mental health
- Physical health

Support in each area is offered in three tiers.



Tier 1: School-wide
Low-intensity, typically short-term services offered to all students



Tier 2: Targeted Programs
Services typically provided in groups to students with a common need

CISGA state office

Work in schools to plan services and provide support to students.
