SMOKE-FREE ENVIRONMENT

All internal areas are smoke-free environments. Please respect this and refrain totally from smoking inside the house. Smokers can use the outside deck and parking area.

ARTWORKS

Throughout the home, classic French and Italian pieces keep company with Chinese antiques, Persian and Afghani rugs and Thai silk cushions, collected locally and overseas.

TV CD/DVD ENTERTAINMENT SYSTEM

To turn on the TV press the red button at the top of the remote. Your TV has 38 channels.

Storms or heavy rain can occasionally affect the signal.

The Bose surround-sound CD/DVD system is housed in cabinet next to the fireplace in the lounge room.

- The on / off, volume, and choice of CD / DVD is operated from the remote control.
- The open / close button for the CD / DVD tray is on the unit itself, tilt up the left side of the black Perspex cover.

To play a DVD, switch on the television and the DVD player before pressing the TV/VIDEO button on the remote control. Select INPUT 1, the correct channel for the DVD player, and you're good to go. There is also a USB port – great for reviewing all those holiday photos.



KEEP THE BUGS AWAY

There are candles outside – please remember to put them out when you are done.

A note for your comfort – in the evening, if lights are on and doors/ windows open you will invite bugs into your villa.

You'll find insect repellent in the laundry cupboard.

FRENCH DOOR

To lock

1. Lift the handle up firmly then release.

2. Turn the thumbturn lock anticlockwise.

3. Test the door to make sure it is locked.

BBQ

The BBQ is there for your use and recreational enjoyment, as with all appliances and amenities, you will find it clean on your arrival, with the understanding, it will be left clean after use.

Disposable aluminium foil trays for barbecuing are prepared for your convenience and comes in handy during preparation, cooking and plating and less mess when it's time for cleaning up.

DAMAGE

Guests will be asked to pay for any costs incurred resulting from malicious damage to Villa Talia.

WEATHER

The same dramatic weather that can make Tasmania so spectacular also tends to find its way into open windows and doors, so please keep them closed during strong wind, storms or heavy rain. You will also need to make sure the outdoor umbrella is closed. Please take care on the decking – it can be slippery when wet.

WATER USE

The water supply for the house and garden is collected from the roof and stored in large rainwater tanks on the property. We would greatly appreciate a conservative approach to water use.

The water is excellent for drinking – taste the difference! The water is also very soft and so you will need less laundry detergent and shampoo compared to normal town water.

WASTE WATER

Waste water is treated on the property with an aerobic process treatment system. Please help us ensure that the system works well by following a few simple rules:

Do not put cooking oil or fat into the system – put it in the garbage bin.

Do not flush anything except toilet paper – place sanitary pads, tampons, nappies, wipes etc in the bin provided.

WASTE SYSTEM MALFUNCTION

In the unlikely event that the waste system malfunctions such as power outage, a signal will sound from the panel next to the front door. Let us know with a call to 0427 901 188. Meanwhile you can still use the system.



HEATING AND COOLING

For your comfort we have an electric central heating and cooling system and two Jetmaster gas fires, one in the lounge room and another in bedroom one.

Operation of central electric heating / cooling system

- The control panel for the system is located below the wall clock in the dining area.
- The on / off button for the system is at the top right corner of the control panel. Press the button, a red light appears, the system is on. Press the button and the red light goes out, the system is off.
- Temperature control for the whole house is from the one panel. The temperature will be set at around 20 deg C for you. To increase or decrease the temperature pull down the flap of the panel and locate the 3rd toggle switch from the left (it has a thermometer symbol) and change the temperature as required.

Operation of the Jetmaster gas fires

- For a convenient and cosy open fire effect, we have two 'Jetmaster' gas fires, one in the lounge room and another in the bedroom one.
- The pilot light will be on for you.
- To switch on the fire press the bottom end of the large rectangular switch located on the right side-wall of the chimney breast. After a few seconds the fire will light automatically.
- To switch off the fire press the top end of the large rectangular switch.
- Please note the power to the 'Jetmaster' fan should remain on all the time. It is the middle switch on the power point behind the leather chair in the lounge room and to the right of fireplace in the bedroom.
- Please conserve energy by turning off the heating as you leave.



INDUCTION COOKTOP

Warning: The area around the cooktop is electromagnetically charged therefore could be a risk for people fitted with pacemakers. Please keep credit cards, pocket calculators etc. well away from the cooktop.

Cooking with induction is very quick and responsive.

The middle switch of the power point on the wall just left of the cook-top should stay on all the time.

You'll find all the details on using the induction cooktop in the manual located in the bottom drawer under the stove.

STEAM OVEN OPERATION

If you are unfamiliar with steam oven cooking and wish to try, please refer to the Miele instruction manual located in the bottom drawer under the stove.

LAUNDRY

There's an iron, washing machine, complimentary detergent and clothes dryer for your use. Please refer to the manuals. The clotheslines is under the veranda outside the laundry.

Wines and some pantry items are priced. Please leave payment in the honesty box.

YOGA / MEDITATION MATS

There is good shore access to the Huon River at many locations between Huonville and Port Huon, on both sides of the river. Please take note that upstream from Castle Forbes Bay, an inland waters angling licence is required. Downstream from that point, no licence is required. Try your luck for sea-run trout and escapee Atlantic salmon.

KAYAKING

Kayaks, paddles and PFDs (life jackets) are available for hire at your own risk. Watch the weather, stay close to shore, paddle in company if possible and always wear a PFD.

BICYCLES

Bikes and helmets are available for hire at your own risk. You are required by law to wear an approved bicycle helmet.

HELICOPTER

We work with award-winning Tasmanian Air Tours to provide scenic flights as well as transporting guests to our private helipad.

WILDLIFE


During your visit, you may encounter some of Tasmania's wonderful wildlife – keep an eye out for wallabies, quolls and echidnas on the ground, watch for dolphins at sea, and look up to see wedge-tailed eagles, sea eagles and many other species of Tasmania's unique birdlife.

Villa Talia is also like many Australian country properties, with lots of uneven ground and rocks and sometimes falling branches. Snakes, spiders and creepy crawlies are just part of the great outdoors. When walking, keep out of the long grasses. The rule is if you can't see where you are stepping, then don't walk there!If you go through a closed gate, please respect the law of the bush and close it behind you.

SNAKES

If you see a snake when walking: STOP. Don't go near it- retreat SLOWLY. Snakes respond to fast movements, assuming danger. If a snake feels threatened, it may become aggressive. If you leave it alone, it will slither off. Please note: Children/infants need to be supervised by an adult at all times. It would be devastating if a child was hurt. Visitors to Villa Talia enter at your own risk.

Potential hazards aside, we appreciate your visit and hope you will enjoy your stay at our beautiful hilltop villa.







FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Does the Huon Valley typically do any special pre-Christmas activities (ie. a Christmas market, long lunch, or food market)?

In previous years, The Willie Smith Apple Shed have held a Christmas market in the lead up to Christmas, and last year, the Port Cygnet Cannery held a similar one day market a few week's out from Christmas which was hugely popular – fingers crossed it runs again this year, but too early to confirm at this stage. There has also been a Vegan Community Christmas lunch held on the Franklin Foreshore which has been held for several years now which you may be able to find out details through the Franklin Palais for when/if it is being run again this year. The Geeveston Feast (monthly event held on the 1st Thursday of each month) usually does a large event which coincides with the launch of their annual Christmas display within the Geeveston Town Hall (and Visitor Centre) at Geeveston too. In late December, you can also pick up fresh apricot and cherries from roadside stalls and simply leave your money in an honesty box. Make sure to sample local cheeses, vegetables and mushrooms and even saffron.

2. Are there any 'hidden' wineries or cider makers that offer tastings by appointment?

Home Hill Winery is regarded as one of the country's leading producers of premium pinot noir. It's also a popular lunch venue with a restaurant overlooking the vines. Check out Elsewhere Vineyard , Kate Hill Wines and Two Bud Spur Vineyard cellar doors as well. For cider drinkers, Willie Smith's Apple Shed – an organic cider pioneer – Frank's Cider and Pagan Cider all welcome visitors. Be sure to try Pagan's cherry cider.

Tucked away on hillsides and riverbanks there are many more small producers. Jim Chatto, renowned winemaker at Pepper Tree in the Hunter Valley, has planted his own Isle Vineyard with pinot noir at Glaziers Bay. Chatto, who has a passion for Burgundy, says: "This part of the world has the potential to be among the most exciting sites for pinot noir anywhere in Australia."

Don't forget to visit small producers such as Sailor Seeks Horse, Mewstone, Hartzview Vineyard, Simple Cider (Franklin), and Heriots Point Vineyard (Castle Forbes Bay). For some of these, you would be best to contact them to ascertain exactly what they're arrangements are for visits. There is also Church Hill Brewery (Ranelagh) which might be of interest too. Also, our neighbour has the Tas-Saff farm and cellar door is open for saffron gin tastings - Bookings essential.

3. In general, do wineries and restaurants in the Huon Valley still operate over the Christmas/Boxing Day long weekend?

Yes, especially the major ones such as Home Hill Winery and Restaurant, Frank's Cider House, The Apple Shed, Osteria at Petty Sessions, Port Cygnet Cannery, Old Bank of Cygnet – in fact you could probably safely assume those listed within this story on HVT website, could be a good guide.

If you've seen Matthew Evans on the SBS program The Gourmet Farmer, you'll know about Fat Pig Farm – it's at Glaziers Bay, not far from Villa Talia and if you're here on a Friday, you might like to join one of their famous Friday Feasts. Tickets available here **https://fatpig.farm/restaurant**/

Sushi master Masaaki Koyama, who used to run a tiny holein-the-wall eatery, will soon reopen in Geeveston. Port Cygnet Cannery is home to a wood-fired oven, café and the Sailor Seeks Horse cellar door.

4. Are there any wineries or restaurants you would recommend for a Boxing Day lunch ?

5. Are there any particularly good delis, bakeries, butchers, etc or spots to pick up delicious items for a self-catered nonseafood Christmas lunch?


Summer Kitchen (Ranelagh), Ranelagh General Store (Ranelagh), Glen Huon Dairy Farm Shop (Glen Huon), Valley Meats (Huonville), Griggs Butcher (Huonville), Harvest and Light (Geeveston), Osteria at Petty Sessions (Franklin), Red Velvet Lounge (Cygnet), Cygnet Garden Larder (Cygnet), Cygnet Woodfired Bakery (Cygnet), Bakehouse Distillery (Dover) would probably be a good starting point.

There are so many good choices around the area -Drip Beach (Cygnet), Mickey's Beach (near Randalls Bay), Randalls Bay (Randalls Bay), Kent Beach (Dover), Verona Sands (Verona Sands), Garden Island Creek (Garden Island Creek), The Narrows (Strathblane), Southport, Cockle Creek. Enjoy!

TAS-SAFF

You'll find Tas-Saff perched high on the hill overlooking Glaziers Bay. Tas-Saff pioneered the saffron industry in Australia in the late 1980s. Saffron is harvested each year during April and May. The lilac crocus flowers are picked early each morning – the rare and valuable spice collected from the fiery red stigma of the flowers has been valued for its culinary and medicinal properties for thousands of years.

Tas-Saf offer free saffron gin and saffron tea tastings.
