Log onto u3attg.org.au then click on members login.
You will be presented with two buttons: the "how to register button will give you a step-by-step guide to registering for 2023. The "member login" will take you to MyU3A and you will need your ID and password that has been sent out earlier from auto@myu3a.net. You will receive emails from this address in future as this is the generic U3A email address.

For those unable to register online at home, for whatever reason, such as not knowing your ID and password or not receiving those details, we will be having volunteers available on Tuesday mornings in room 6 from the start of term 4. The earlier start to registrations is to help us all cope with this new system.

We will not be running the usual 2 week registration in November.

Please log on to our website and have a look at the new system, you can't break anything, look at the courses and read the how to register guide.

This new online database is "first come first served" system and if you wish to secure your place in a class that has limits to the numbers, you will need to register promptly, as we will be opening registrations to new members from November 1st.

If you are interested in a new experience and want to try something different, you will still need to contact the Group Leader to check space availability prior to enrolling in the class for the first time in 2023.

Keith Fitzgerald ran our earlier database for many years very successfully, but when we had to move from Windows XP to Windows 10, because XP was no longer supported, the database was not compatible with Windows 10.

Fortunately we had a white knight arrive in Mike Coleman who was able to redo the database in Microsoft Access and we have been able to continue for the last 7 years or so.

As we found out in January this year, we cannot rely on one person to keep our

systems going. We had a computer crash, the database corrupted and due to ill health Mike was not available to come to our rescue. We are indebted to Tom Mittiga who spent a considerable time rebuilding the system.

Now we understand that Microsoft will no longer be supporting Access, we need to move to third party support so that we are not relying on one or two of our members to keep our systems running.

Inner North U3A have been running the MyU3A database successfully for several years now and we have been very fortunate to have received considerable help from their excellent IT administrator Louise Kennedy and we have greatly appreciated her assistance.

Thanking you all in advance for your continued patience as we continue to keep our systems upto-date with changes that are forced upon us.

We will have a Group Leaders meeting next term where we can demonstrate what will be available for them in the new year when all our members have re-registered.


From the lake we headed to the plant nursery for a native bush scene, followed by the next criteria, Lines and Frames, of which there were many, but, did I get the right one?


