

Thanksgiving is right around the corner, and with SNAP benefits set to expire November 1st-the need in our community is greater than ever.

Shelf-stable food donations are needed!

Please consider bringing nonperishable food items to Calvary. Donations will be distributed to local food banks in our area, and we'll also keep a supply here at the church to share with families who reach out for assistance.

Calvary member Shirley Parroccini contacted a local food bank to learn what items are most useful. Below is a summary of what she found:

Items that are shelf-stable and in high demand are highlighted.

- Everyone donates boxed Kraft Mac & Cheese, but it often goes unused—it requires milk and butter, which are hard to get from food banks.
- BOXED MILK is a treasure, especially for children who receive lots of cereal.
- Everyone donates pasta and sauce-plenty on hand!
- They cannot eat all the awesome CANNED VEGGIES AND SOUP unless you put a can opener in too or buy CANS WITH POP TOPS.
- COOKING OIL is a luxury but very much needed.
- SPICES, SALT AND PEPPER would be a real gift.
- TEA BAGS AND COFFEE show care and comfort.
- SUGAR AND FLOUR are considered treats.
- Fresh produce is always appreciated when available.
- Seeds are wonderful gifts in spring and summer for those who like to grow their own food.
- Fresh meat is rarely donated.
- TUNA AND CRACKERS make a great, easy lunch.
- Hamburger Helper is plentiful, but it needs ground beef to go with it.
- Peanut butter and jelly are common, but sandwich bread is not.
- Butter or margarine is nice to have.
- Eggs are a real commodity.
- CAKE MIX AND FROSTING make it possible to celebrate birthdays.
- **DISHWASHING DETERGENT** is very expensive and always appreciated.
- FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS are considered a luxury and often bring tears of gratitude.
- STOVE TOP STUFFING is always a hit!
