- 45 From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon.
- And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"
- 47 When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "This man is calling for Elijah."
- 48 At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink.
- 49 But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him."
- 50 Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last.
- 51 At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. The earth shook, and the rocks were split.
- 52 The tombs also were opened, and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised.
- 53 After his resurrection they came out of the tombs and entered the holy city and appeared to many.

MESSAGE FROM CALVARY'S HOSPITALITY PARKING TEAM


Steeler 1:00 PM Home Games: September 14, October 12, November 2, November 16

ALLEGHENY HISTORIC PRESERVATION SOCIETY

WHAT IS AHPS — AND WHAT DOES IT HAVE TO DO WITH CALVARY?

Over 30 years ago, Calvary Church was on the verge of closing. The roof and windows leaked, the Sanctuary was shut down because there was no money to heat it, and there was no pastor in place. Things looked dire.

At that time, the Rev. Bob Richards, Director of Church Union (whose office was where our pastor's office is now), stepped in to serve as Calvary's "volunteer" minister. At the same time, concerned neighbors and friends formed the Allegheny Historic Preservation Society (AHPS) – a nonprofit organization with one purpose: to secure grant and foundation funding to save Calvary's historic building.

Their efforts were extraordinary. Over three million dollars has since been raised to restore and upgrade our building: the slate roof was repaired, the Tiffany windows were restored, an elevator was installed, carpeting was replaced, the Sanctuary was reopened, and the organ was restored. Within just $2\frac{1}{2}$ years, Calvary had a full-time pastor again. The list of improvements continues to grow – because when there are resources, much can be done!
