CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING — MAY 15, 2025

1. Pastor's Report (Rev. Beth Nelson)

2. Finance Report (Chris Sweeney)

- Reviewed January-April 2025 financials.

- Capital Campaign funds to be tracked on the balance sheet.
- The 2025 Budget presented. Will be discussed at next Finance Committee meeting.

- Phase One Renovation to begin in the fall of 2025.
- Full Capital Campaign plan in development.

- Ongoing projects:
