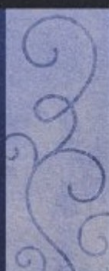

- **Dishwashing detergent and feminine hygiene products** – always appreciated and often overlooked

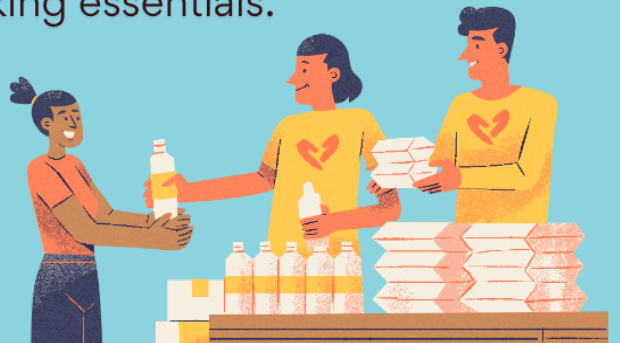
A Few Tips
