



EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE



CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY

It has been agreed that keeping the congregation at Calvary informed about the discussions at church council meetings would be valuable. Going forward, we will provide a summary of the topics discussed and decisions made during these meetings. You can expect to be given this summary in the bulletin 2-3 weeks after each meeting. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to Rev. Beth Nelson.

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING – THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 20, 2025

The February church council summary report provides updates on key activities at Calvary, including staffing, building projects, finances, missions, and upcoming initiatives. The church remains focused on growth, ministry, and missions, while also planning for future pastoral leadership and ensuring strong communication within the congregation. Key points include:

STAFFING

• Mary Emili is praised as a compassionate and valuable assistant in the office, available on Mondays and Thursday afternoons.

FILMING AT THE CHURCH

• A romantic comedy, Heirloom, was filmed at the church, generating excitement. The producer purchased jewelry from the Calvary Store and plans to return for more scenes. The church will be credited in the film.

PARSONAGE HEATING ISSUE

• The parsonage boiler was compromised, but repairs were made, and insurance will cover a full replacement.

FINANCE

- Chris Sweeny and Rick Sustakoski were appointed Co-Chairs of the Finance Committee. A discussion about rising facilities expenses, primarily due to snow removal costs, was mentioned.
- The committee will present financial trends and anomalies at future meetings. There will be more streamlined communication via committee email groups.

STAFF-PARISH RELATIONS

- Rev. Nelson has committed to serving as pastor until June 2026. The committee
 recommends preparing for a full-time pastor position after that, with a budget increase
 to accommodate salary and benefits.
- Future pastoral appointments are being actively discussed, ensuring Calvary has an appropriate match.

TRUSTEES

 A major renovation plan has been broken into three phases, with Phase 1 (new restrooms and adjacent areas) estimated at \$350,000. The church currently has \$160,000 in building funds. A Capital Campaign will be launched to fund the renovations, with additional efforts for local support.

COMMUNICATIONS

• A new church website will launch soon, with a directory project and newsletter updates. The website will also feature a Capital Campaign and donation options.

ARCHIVES & HISTORY

• The Archives and History Team is working on creating a docent team, updating historical displays, and writing a history of Calvary and its Methodist roots.

MISSIONS COMMITTEE

• The committee is working to strengthen partnerships with local ministries, develop resource books and cards for outreach, and engage the congregation in mission efforts such as blessing bags.

UPCOMING MEETINGS & PROJECTS

- The Food Ministry is expanding, hoping for a fourth team for fellowship meals.
- The Allegheny Historic Preservation Society is looking forward to collaborating on restoration projects.
- The church will host an orientation session for leadership, and efforts to recruit volunteers for Event and Prayer Coordinator roles are underway.
- A draft of a "Social Media Policy" was shared for review, aiming to address challenges in today's digital landscape.


