


Personal Development 2023-2024

Padgate Academy's Personal development curriculum has been developed to enrich students' life experiences. At Padgate Academy, personal development is embedded in every aspect of school life – during curriculum time, tutor time, CAS enrichment, trips, assemblies and additional performances and presentations. At Padgate, we pride ourselves on ensuring that our personal development offer sets them up for life after school. The Personal Development curriculum consists of PSHE (including the new RSE framework), Careers and Enterprise and Citizenship. These core themes will be half termly in Personal Development lessons, the assembly timetable and tutor time messages.


Our intent is to:

- Ensure students have the expertise to make informed choices in life and work outside of the Academy
- Develop responsible, respectful, healthy and active citizens
- Promote Spiritual, moral, social, cultural and equality of opportunity
- Develop students' character, giving them qualities, they need to flourish in society
- Develop students' confidence and resilience so that they can keep themselves mentally healthy
- Ensure students have the knowledge on how to stay safe
- Prepare pupils for the next phase of education
- Provide opportunities that prepare students for modern Britain, promoting British values through ethos of the school

- Support students in understanding healthy relationships through age appropriate sex education
- Provide opportunities and experiences that will allow students to succeed in and out of the classroom

Our Implementation: Our Personal Development curriculum has been designed to be delivered during a dedicated timetabled lesson every week. This new addition to the Padgate Curriculum has been planned in conjunction with the PSHE association guidance and The Health Education and Relationships Education (primary) and the secondary Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) compulsory guidance.

Our Tutor time (see below) has also be designed to support the Personal development of each year group. Through bespoke tutor and CEIAG programmes, assembly programme, enrichment activities and the support of external bodies.



A 40 minute weekly Personal Development lesson will be delivered mostly by their form tutor and bespoke staff where appropriate, students will receive ageappropriate lessons on the key following themes that build in complexity throughout each year group on the following themes.

- Health and Wellbeing
- Relationships
- Living in the wider world Citizenship
- Living in the wider world Careers (CIEAG)
- KS4 Religious studies
- Staying safe

We also recognise that at specific times of the year we will need to focus on important key issues, so for example during examination periods we will deliver sessions and or assemblies sharing the importance of stress management and promoting good revision habits. To accompany our PD sessions we have highlighted key events that we feel students need to be exposed to, this maybe in the form of the planned weekly assembly or a drop down tutor time event through the week.

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Personal development curriculum overview

RSE

Our Relationships and Sex Education program is rooted within our Personal Development curriculum. The RSE programme at Padgate Academy has been developed to be inclusive and enable students to understand their bodies, to reflect on their relationship values and to be able to openly discuss relationships and sex. Relationships Education is compulsory for all primary schools in England and Relationships and Sex Education compulsory in all secondary schools. At the heart of these sessions there is a focus on keeping children safe. <u>Keeping</u> <u>Children Safe in Education (KCSIE)</u> sets out that all schools should ensure children are taught about safeguarding, as part of a broad and balanced curriculum.

Good practice allows children an open forum to discuss potentially sensitive issues. Such discussions can lead to increased safeguarding reports. Children should be made aware of how to raise their concerns or make a report and how any report will be handled. This should include processes when they have a concern about a friend or peer. We write to parents at the start of the academic year to outline our curriculum plans for the delivery of RSE and direct them to read our PD curriculum area on the website for more details and also provide a <u>PD@padgateacademy.co.uk</u> email for parents to contact us directly if they would like to discuss or ask a question.

Protected characteristics:

The equality act came into force in 2010, it covers everyone in Britain and protects them from harassment and victimisation. Everyone in Britain is protected. This is because the Equality Act protects people against discrimination because of the protected characteristics that we all have. CIAG Careers education, information advice and guidance;

Our Vision for careers at Padgate Academy is to provide all of our pupils with a first-class career's education. One which develops their skills for learning, life and employability.

To help us achieve this vision we have put together an extensive careers programme that allows pupils to discover, explore and develop their knowledge and understanding of careers options and choices in KS3 and then move on to experience and apply in KS4.

The programme is designed to fully prepare all pupils for the world after high school. It is reviewed termly to ensure its efficiency and supported by the SLT and board of governors.

Our Careers Programme Aims to:

- Inspire our young people and raise their aspirations.
- Allow pupils to explore careers and activities based around their interests and aspirations.
- Develop understanding of a wide range and variety of career options and possibilities and how this can be achieved.
- Experience a variety of employer encounters, workplace visits and higher education settings alongside enrichment trips and activities.
- Apply their knowledge and understanding of careers to their future pathway, to guide and direct them on their journey after Padgate Academy.

We ensure that our aims are met by linking everything we do to the Gatsby Benchmarks, and the needs of pupils. We ask pupils, staff and employers to rate and review all activities so that they can be evaluated for their effectiveness and impact and adapted accordingly.

LYFTA (during Tutor time)

'Lyfta invites students to experience different cultures and perspectives. It gives them the opportunity to see and connect with positive human stories from around the world - modelling resilience, problem-solving, teamwork, and many other critical skills, values, and competencies. Lyfta helps teachers nurture the global citizens of tomorrow.'

To complement our personal development sessions during Tutor time Monday-Thursday at Key stage 3 students will receive **one weekly LYFTA session** (Sessions last 20-30mins) focused upon developing personal attributes such as resilience, motivation, and values education, whilst creating immersive opportunities to explore the wider world. During Autumn 1 student will follow suggested LYFTA topics:

(As an introduction/familiarisation scheme) From Autumn 2 sessions will interlink with core theme during the week such as events and assemblies. Teachers may explore LYFTA further by implementing topics and stories into the curriculum.

CAS enrichment rationale

Our students deserve the best, by thriving on enriched experiences, we want to maximise and enhance every student's potential. The intention being that it will strengthen students personal and interpersonal skills whilst complimenting academic studies.

Intent:

Creativity, Activity and Society (CAS) will be the focus of a sustained enrichment programme over the course of the academic year, students can opt in and try many experiences or clubs throughout the year.

- **Creativity** –Exploring all aspects of creativity, expression, imagination and innovation
- **Activity** –Involving physical exertion, healthy lifestyle, team sports, expeditions
- **Society** Collaborating with the community, making a positive contribution to society.
