




Our enrichment programs offers avenues for students to explore diverse interests, including The Duke of Edinburgh award. Many trips and events also take place throughout the academic year for all students.

Relationships and staying safe

PSHE (Personal, Social, Health, and Economic education) and RSE (Relationships and Sex Education) are statutory components of the school curriculum. PSHE covers essential topics such as making healthy choices, knowing how to stay safe and how to practice good mental health and wellbeing. While RSE focuses on developing healthy relationships, puberty and understanding human sexuality, ensuring students receive a well-rounded education to navigate their personal and social lives.



Living in the wider world

A key component of PSHE education as outlined by the PSHE Association, equips students with the knowledge and skills to navigate society effectively. It covers areas such as financial literacy, citizenship, career education (CIEAG), digital literacy, and understanding social and cultural diversity. This aspect of PSHE aims to prepare students to contribute positively to their communities and understand their roles as global citizens, fostering a sense of responsibility and active participation in society



Religious studies

Religious Studies, helps students understand diverse religious beliefs and worldviews, fostering respect and tolerance in a multicultural society. It covers the major world religions, ethical issues, and the impact of religion on individuals and communities. This aspect aims to promote spiritual development, critical thinking, and an appreciation for cultural diversity, preparing students to engage thoughtfully and respectfully with different perspectives in a pluralistic world.



CAS enrichment

At Padgate, we believe our students deserve the very best. Through a wealth of enriching experiences, we aim to maximize and enhance every student's potential. Our students emerge as self-confident, well-balanced individuals ready to make a positive impact on society.

We believe that an exciting and enriching environment fosters a wide range of virtues, along with our PRIDE values. Our program focuses on three core strands: Creativity, Activity, and Society, inspired by the world-renowned International Baccalaureate framework. 

Rewards



With PRIDE loyalty cards, students can earn bronze, silver, gold, and platinum badges during Proud to be Padgate reward assemblies. These recognise achievements and contributions linked to the Student Charter, fostering a culture of pride and excellence within the school community.



The Golden Ticket incentive encourages high standards and core values during the last fortnight of each term. Students earn Golden Tickets for demonstrating exceptional behavior and effort, entering them into an endof-term prize draw. This initiative motivates students to maintain excellence until the final day of term, fostering a positive school environment.

PRIDE postcards provide instant rewards for students who exemplify our core values. Staff can recognise positive behavior by awarding these postcards, which can be redeemed for incentives like privileges or treats. This initiative fosters a culture of recognition and motivates students to uphold our values consistently.





Student leadership

Student leadership is crucial for developing our students' character and preparing them for life beyond Padgate Academy. Investing in student leadership directly shapes the future leaders of our schools and communities. At Padgate, we believe students should actively participate in Academy life, contributing to both the wider improvement and the overall learning experience
