Year 7 - CURRICULUM BULLETIN Summer 1



What the students are learning in

English	Students will be continuing to explore Charles Dickens' classic 19 th Century Victorian novel 'Oliver Twist'. Students are exploring the many characteristics of heroes and villains in
	Literature, as well as some Victorian context that will provide them with essential knowledge needed throughout their English studies at Padgate.
	ASSESSMENT - 1. How is the character of Bill Sikes presented?
	This is a written assessment where students will be expected to write multiple
	analytical paragraphs on a character they have studied from the novel. They will be
	taught how to structure a Literature essay and write a basic thesis statement to
	accompany their written responses.
	2. Multiple Choice Quiz – contextual, plot and character knowledge of the novel.
Maths	During this half term, students will be looking at reflection and rotation. We will work with
	fractions, decimals, and percentages including finding percentages of amounts. We will
	introduce probability and how to calculate chance. We will encounter linear equations and
	how to solve them. We will also work with angles in mathematical constructions.
	ASSESSMENT - End of year assessments will take place in the last week of the term,
	testing everything studied so far in Year 7.
Science	Students will explore the chemistry of acidic and basic substances and what happens when
	they are reacted together. Students will then move onto the biology topic of digestion 7
	nutrition, linking to the role of acids in the stomach. All homework is set 'Friday for Friday'
	online at 'Educake.co.uk'.

Computer Science	Students will look at spreadsheets learning what cell references are and how to perform
	basic calculations in the context of a budget

Spanish	This term students will be continuing to develop their awareness and understanding of
	phonics, applying it to a range of situations and conversations. They will additionally further
	improve their understanding of present tense within the topic of 'Free time activities.'
	ASSESSMENT - Progress Check: Grammar, Translation, Reading, Listening sections.
	Students are not expected to prepare in advance, this is to check their longer-term
	topic knowledge/retrieval. This will take place towards the end of the term.
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Art	Students will study textile art this term and gain knowledge of key time periods in history
	linked to weaving and the cotton mills. Students will develop their application of textile
	weaving whilst responding to the contemporary artist Micheal Brennand- Wood and
	traditional artist Annie Albers.
	ASSESSMENT –in lesson, recalling textile and weaving techniques.
Design and	Well done to all students for completing their wooden toy car models from last
Technology	term – there were some very creative and well-made examples! This term students
	will begin their second Design project – creating an eyecatching fabric model of a
	soft toy, with custom-designed packaging, which they will design for themselves
	using inspiration from famous character designs. We will conduct research into
	similar designs and examples from their own lives. After developing our design
	ideas we will develop our own soft-toy practical outcomes using a range of
	practical and creative skills. Over the Easter Holidays a homework project has been
	set, which will be due upon the return to school. There will be a halfway project
	assessment and in the final week of term their final project assessment. Design Club
	is on each Friday afterschool for students to complete homework, lesson work
	(written/practical), or to complete their own personal design projects under
	supervision.
	ASSESSMENT – There will be an end of year assessment to follow on from the recent
	halfway assessment.
Cooking and	In Cooking and Nutrition students will prepare and cook a frittata and carrot cupcakes. They
Nutrition	will develop knowledge of the function of ingredients in bread and they will research the
	popularity of baked goods in the UK and take part in a Great British bake-off competition.
	Students will build on practical skills developed earlier in the term including weighing,
	measuring, grilling and whisking.
