English	<p>Group 1 (7,8) - In English, students will be exploring the theme of identity through a range of texts. This includes several poems and extracts from various novels. Maths	<p>Group 1 (7,8) - In Mathematics, students will begin by exploring number and the properties of number. This includes number place value, reading and writing numbers, ordering numbers, odd and even numbers and number sequences.</p> <p>Group 2 (9, 10, 11) – Students will begin by exploring number and the properties of number. This includes number place value, reading and writing numbers, ordering numbers, odd and even numbers and number sequences, negative numbers, significant figures, and decimal places.</p>
Science	In science, students will learn all about the origins of biology.
Computer Science	In Computer Science, students will learn how to use technology safely, respectfully and responsibly; recognise acceptable/unacceptable behaviour; identify a range of ways to report concerns about content and how to stay safe online
History	<p>Group 1 (7,8) - Students will be learning all about sanitation over time. This includes the Iron Age, Romans and Medieval England.</p> <p>Group 2 (9, 10, 11) – Students will be learning about life in Medieval England.</p>
Religious Studies	<p>Group 1 (7,8) - Students will consider what makes a good leader with a focus on the important leaders in the Abrahamic religions.</p> <p>Group 2 (9, 10, 11) – Students will study prejudice and discrimination focusing on Martin Luther King,</p>
Geography	<p>Group 1 (7,8) - Students will be learning all about their local area with a focus on map skills and physical and human features in Europe.</p> <p>Group 2 (9, 10, 11) – Students will study Africa including African climate, landscapes and vegetation.</p>
Life skills/ ASDAN	Students will be learning about important life choices and what considerations are made when making important choices.
Food Technology	Students will begin learning about healthy diets. This includes the dangers of sugar and the importance of vegetables. This also includes the importance of safety in the kitchen and how kitchen can serve safe food to customers
Art	<p>Group 1 (7,8) - In art, students will be considering what Art means to them. This includes the formal elements of art and colour theory.</p> <p>Group 2 (9, 10, 11) – Students will be learning about Mondrian and abstract art.</p>
Drama	Workshop based activities to develop speaking, listening, communication and social skills. Students will also be introduced to some key drama skills including freeze frames and thought tracks.
Music	Introduction to music and piano skills. Pupils will learn basic piano skills and learn a piece of music on the keyboard.
P.E	Students will be developing and demonstrating skills in communication and teamwork through badminton and netball. Students will also have one session per fortnight from the Warrington Wolves Foundation.
