Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome to the final letter of the academic year. It has again been one which has tested us all as we continue to deal with the challenges we have been presented with during the Covid pandemic.

Duke of Edinburgh

On Thursday 15th and Friday 16th July, 6 of our year 9 students completed their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Expedition around Warrington. Due to COVID measures in place, the students were restricted to the Warrington area, but this did not bring the mood down in the group.

On day 1, they set off from the Academy, made their way to Woolston and over the canal to Thelwall. The students were in high spirits setting off and got to their checkpoints throughout the day with ease. They all took a checkpoint of the route and completed their map skills to a high standard. The heat also made it more difficult throughout the day, but the team did so well to get back to school. The students then showed off their camping skills, putting up their tents on the school field; they also cooked their tea on the Trangia's.





Day 2 was even hotter! Students headed out towards Daresbury in the school minibus and picked up the Bridgewater Canal on their checkpoints. They successfully finished at one of the many farms in Stretton and were taken for a well-deserved McDonalds at the end!

All 6 students showed great Teamwork, Tenacity and Trust throughout their expedition. They worked well together, and hopefully they will go on to do their Duke of Edinburgh Silver in year 10!

McFoodBank

Since the pandemic hit last March, Miss McKittrick has organised hundreds of food parcels to be delivered to some of our most vulnerable families. She has now setup a foodbank (the aptly named McFoodBank) within the Academy, which is stocked with food provided by all members of the Padgate community.



Staff have been fantastic in providing extra provisions by putting a few additional food items in their shopping trolley each week, helping to ensure a regular supply of food parcels for when families need them most.

A massive thank you to the staff, students and community for supporting the Academy operated McFoodBank as part of our ongoing charity efforts to make a difference within our local community during these trying times.

We hope our contributions will be of great comfort to the people most in need at this time.

Uniform

Our school rules regarding uniform remain unchanged and full uniform is expected in September.





All outdoor coats must be plain black or grey and hoodies will not be permitted under any circumstances; shoes must be plain black leather look, and of course, no training shoes.

Jewellery, including earrings, is not permitted for health and safety reasons and also because it is inappropriate for school wear. Extreme hair colours and styles are not encouraged, and we request your co-operation in this matter. Should any student wish to have a piercing or false nails applied then these need to be done at the start of the summer holiday so they can be removed for their return to the Academy. Further guidance on appropriate footwear and hairstyles for school can be found on our website.

Normal service resumes in P.E. and students no longer need to attend the Academy in their P.E. kit, they can bring it with them and change for the lesson.

Holidays in Term Time

I must draw your attention to important amendments to legislation surrounding holidays in term time.

Since September 2013, the new law does not give any entitlement to parents to take their child on holiday during term time. In the academic year 2011 to 2012, 9.7% of all absences in England were due to parents taking their children out of school during term time. This high level of absence led the DfE to make this important change to legislation.

This new legislation is designed to bring about increased attendance and improving standards in all schools. Further information can be obtained from www.dfe.gov.uk.

Any applications for leave of absence must be in exceptional circumstances and the Principal must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave.

Parents can be fined by the Local Authority for taking their child on holiday during term time without consent from the school.

As an Academy, we fully appreciate the financial difficulties that some parents face when booking holidays, particularly during school holidays. However, there is an expectation that all schools introduce firm policies and stringent checks to ensure that there is a significant reduction in the number of absences during term time.

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the Academy to thank you for your full support in this matter by not taking your child out of school during term time.

COVID Home Testing over the Summer Holidays

Students are not required to test during the summer. Their last lateral flow test provided by the Academy should therefore be conducted at home on Thursday 22nd July 2021.

If your child chooses to continue testing over the summer, the academy cannot provide tests, however you can collect a test kit from your local pharmacy or order online here - https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests.

The Academy will **close** for the summer at **12:05 on Friday 23rd July 2021.** I wish your family an enjoyable, restful and safe break. I am sure that your children will return refreshed and eager to continue learning in September.

Start of New Term

Looking forward, it is our intention to re-open in September 2021 with a return to as near normal as possible, whilst following the guidance to schools from the Department of Education and the Public Health Agency. At this point in time there are a number of possible models for the COVID-19 impact over the coming months, however I would ask that you plan for the new term using the following assumptions.

Students will return to the Academy in a staggered manner, as below:

Thursday 2nd September

Year 7 - 08:40am Year 11 - 11:00am Year 10 - 1:00pm

Friday 3rd September

Year 8 - 08:40am Year 9 - 11:00am

As you are aware, when students return to the Academy in September 2021 we are required to offer onsite lateral flow testing for all students, this will be supervised by trained staff. Each student will be offered a lateral flow test on their first day back. A second lateral flow test will then be offered 4 days later.

After the two initial on-site tests, students will be encouraged to continue testing at home twice each week and home testing kits will be provided in the new academic year for all students. Further updates will be provided when students are asked to stop testing, in line with government guidance.
