I had the opportunity to operate the John Deere blade and Cat dozer. Very nice machines.



The headline on the front page of Grass & Grain says it all about this project - "Healing Veterans, healing the land - KLICA donates work to SAVE Farm."

The first week of August KLICA constructed a tile outlet terrace system on the Servicemember Agricultural Vocation Education (SAVE) Farm. This terrace system addressed an erosion concern due to an old terrace system which was no longer functioning and was creating ditches and erosion problems throughout the field.

The KLICA Board of Directors took an interest in the SAVE Farm when they spoke at our January, 2019 Convention. That interest grew into a commitment to assistance and that summer KLICA volunteers utilized Associate provided machinery and materials to install and improve water crossings, improve the area around the headquarters and livestock operation, and clear a path for power lines to reach the farm headquarters.

At that time there was discussion of future needs on the farm with the erosion concern on the cropland being noted as one of the biggest conservation needs and planning to address this issue was set in motion. Although, there were a few minor hiccups along the way this planning came together this past year with a conservation plan developed through the Riley County Conservation District and a tile outlet terrace system laid out and designed by the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service.

NRCS was an instrumental partner in planning and designing this project and we cannot say enough about the technical assistance provided by Dan Gudenkauf, Civil Engineering Technician in Manhattan.

Dan Meyerhoff and Troy Munsch, with the Kansas Association of Conservation Districts (KACD) provided a great team to assist with documentation and promotion of this effort through pictures and video. Melissa Wahl, Virgil Williams, and Tod Bunting, SAVE Farm Staff & Board members stayed on top of this project from the beginning coordinating with the Riley County Conservation District, NRCS, and KLICA. During construction Melissa kept all the workers fed and hydrated. Throughout a long hot and humid week she was always there making sure the workers needs were met.

And it was hot, Kent Henderson and Randy Myers spent many hours in ditches laying pipe. Joe Schletzbaum spent long days in a hot excavator digging ditches. Paul White was there for a week from sun up to sun down pushing dirt, directing machines and people, and ensuring the finished job was farmable and something to be proud of. See the list of additional KLICA members who contributed their time and skills to completion of this project. This job also could not have been accomplished without the machinery, materials, and assistance provided by our Associates. Advanced Drainage Systems provided all the pipe, Berry Tractor a dozer, Foley Equipment a dozer and excavator, Murphy Tractor a motor grader, KanEquip an Excavator, Modern Ag provided satellite systems, J&J Drainage provided end pieces, Joe Scheltzbaum provided risers, and Prins/UFG provided financial assistance. Finally, the KLICA Executive Director operated a couple of dozers! As directed by Paul he pushed around some dirt on the back side of a terrace. Then, as further directed he provided some ice cold beverages for Paul and Jeff after they spent a couple extra hours fixing what he pushed!

\$100 to \$150 dollars. Well earned - not a favorite job.



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
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#### Rambling Thoughts of an Executive Director


