

Kathy Ungerer





money making jobs or his favorite. Among the usual assortment, was the unusual, cleaning out ponds in December.


He had a first recently when a pond prospect required an interpreter. A ten acre "dream farm" cows, chickens, etc., for an Oriental family and only one could speak English.

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Kansas High Hazard Dams A Growing Concern

The Kansas Department of Agriculture recently briefed a legislative committee on dam safety and what they see as a growing concern. Kansas has over 6,000 dams in the state of which over 600 have been determined to be significant or high hazard if breached. The state of Kansas has determined 29 dams to be in unsatisfactory condition and in need of attention to provide for protection of downstream infrastructure.

The state of Kansas does not have the legal authority to require landowners to make needed repairs to these dams. While Kansas has the second most dams in the United States the state is also struggling with the manpower to provide proper oversight of these dams. The state of Kansas utilizes a combination of state and federal funding to address regulatory work on dams. These concerns have resulted in Governor Kelly and the state legislature looking at possible funding and regulatory alternatives to address the repair of high hazard dams and improve the dam inspection process in the state.

The above information was taken from a January 31, 2022 Kansas Reflector article written by Tim Carpenter.

All owners of significant or high hazard dams in the state of Kansas are required to complete and annually review an Emergency Action Plan (EAP). High hazard dams also require a safety inspection by a licensed Professional Engineer every three years and significant hazard dams every five years.

Whether constructed for livestock water or recreation all Kansas landowners should regularly inspect their pond dams regardless of hazard classification. Embankments, principal (pipe) spillway, and emergency spillway are all areas which may need maintenance or repair. Your local United States Department of Agriculture/ Natural Resources Conservation Service and county conservation district can provide information regarding pond maintenance. KLICA contractors can assist with needed maintenance or repairs.
