In Memoriam of Those we Lost in 2020




Lawrence (Larry) Pike

Farmers have confidence in him. He's often their friend and neighbor and he knows a job well done is his best advertisement.

Small boys idolize him, especially his own, and they dream of the day when they can sit at the controls of a powerful tractor changing the landscape. He'd be less uneasy, though, if parents realized that lively boys and big machines just don't mix well while in motion.

A wife must be patient with him and know ahead that supper can wait while he moves a few more yards of dirt, collects an overdue bill or checks up on a job prospect.



State DOT's Received Last Minute Financial Assistance

State departments of transportation are getting \$10 billion in long-awaited emergency aid from a \$900 billion COVID-19 Relief Bill passed by Congress late on December 21 as part of a final year-end legislative package.

President Trump signed the measure on December 27, though he requested "many rescissions under the Impoundment Control Act of 1974" to remove what he termed "wasteful spending."

"Since the early response to the pandemic, state DOTs have faced severe losses in state transportation revenues as vehicle travel declined. This COVID relief bill enables state DOTs to stay on track and support the efficient movement of critical goods and services as they maintain their transportation systems," noted Jim Tymon, Executive Director of the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials, in a statement.

"Furthermore, this timely federal support will help state DOTs to retain their institutional capacities and to be prepared to deliver future infrastructure investment driving economic recovery and growth," he added. Date Established for Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP) Application Deadline for Kansas

Kansas State Conservationist, Karen A. Woodrich, of the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) announced today the Statewide cutoff for Fiscal Year (FY) 2021 Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP) funding. Kansas landowners and eligible entities may apply at any time. However, to be considered for FY 2021 funding opportunities for Kansas Wetland Reserve Easements (WRE) and Agricultural Land Easements (ALE), the application cutoff date is Friday, February 19, 2021. Local NRCS offices will continue to assist landowners who have submitted applications by the cutoff date in order to develop a complete application packet used for ranking. Landowners are encouraged to contact their local NRCS office for specific information regarding an application.

On the Other Side of the Dozer Blade

It's a beautiful morning the day after Christmas with a 40 degree temperature and no wind. After days and nights of howling wind, it's a relief. The birds are busy on the deck; two bags of bird seed were welcome gifts!

Our Christmas was very different than a usual Smelser get-together. It was still a special day, Rusty came up and had dinner with us, so we weren't alone. We chose to stay home. Jean had to work and David had

a bad cold and stayed home across the drive. Jeannie came in the evening. A special gift from a friend at church is an olive wood cross, made with wood from the Holy Land. A reminder of the gospel song "From the Manger to the Cross."

David and Lee have had plenty of work, all varied. The engine overhaul on the 963 loader was a setback. They really missed that versatile machine while it was in the shop.

David recently looked over a 40 acre brush filled clearing job; dogwood so thick he and the owner practically had to crawl on deer trails. David's estimate per acre is more than land used to sell for! As they came out of the brush, David met a game wardenapparently a neighbor had reported two suspicious characters!
