




Betty Lou Myers July 16, 1932 -August 31, 2024





Farm Bill Uncertainty Affecting Ag Producers

The lack of a known safety net will likely affect agricultural producers the rest of 2024 and possibly even into 2025. The 2018 Farm Bill expired on Monday September 30 and according to the American Farm Bureau Federation partisanship is likely the primary reason we don't have a new bill or extension in place. Adding to that, it is a presidential election year and it is a small wonder we have seen little progress. Although an extension of the current Farm Bill would provide some certainty for producers that may not be enough for many producers who are now planning financing for 2025. Due to production costs increasing by 50% or more since 2018, without updated economic information provided in a new Farm Bill producers are left with many questions as they plan for next year. Congress will return to session November 14, and will need to pass a new farm bill or extend the current one by January 1, 2025 to avoid going back to permanent law. Without getting into exactly what that means, suffice it to say our agricultural community needs action on a new Farm Bill sooner rather than later.








KLICA Attends Murphy Tractor & Equipment Co., Inc. Open House
