



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND INCARCERATION




Statistics

- Significant percentage of incarcerated women experienced DV
- DV as a contributing factor to incarceration
- Incarceration creates barriers for victims
- ✓ 32% of incarcerated women experience DV
- \checkmark 40% of men witnessed DV

UNIQUE CHALLENGES IN PRISON

- Limited privacy and control
- Potential for re-victimization or re-traumatization
- Difficulty accessing support services
- * Stigma and shame associated with DV

IMPACT ON MENTAL HEALTH



- > Depression
- > Anxiety
- > PTSD
- > Stress
- > Physical injuries
- > Chronic pain
- Sleep disturbances
- > Self-harm
- Suicide
- Hinder rehabilitation

THE ROLE OF CORRECTIONAL STAFF




- Recognizing signs
- \circ Safe environment
- \circ Appropriate
 - referrals
- Training

- Statute's Definition:
 - List of offenses committed by one "family or household member" against another
- Challenges in application:
 - Intent of the law
 - Family or household member interpretation
 - Practical enforcement
- Potential implications
 - If applied, additional protections
 - If not applied, limited resources
