

FISHING COLUMN

Stishing January 2025

Hello fellow anglers,

S.W. FLORIDA

It's January and 2025 is a new year and a great time to go fishing! This month, near shore, you should be able to find plenty of sheepshead around the edges of the near shore reefs. Fishing for these guys, you should use a 1/0 hook or something close to that with a piece of shrimp. And you could use a 20lb. leader, if the water is really clear. This is the time of year that they move offshore to spawn. They also can be found near the pilings of any structure bridges or docks close to the Gulf. They will get thick on some of the natural ledges, around the 50 ft. range. I have a State of Florida for-hire fishing license that allows me to go as far as 9 miles offshore, so these are the areas that I am talking about.

Also, there is another species that like to travel in a similar way. The species is the flounder. They tend to migrate to the sandy areas close to the Gulf up and down the coast of Southwest Florida. They are less picky about what they eat and they will eat frozen sardines and shrimp, too. You can use a similar rig to harvest these guys on a 1/0 hook and 20 lb. leader. You may use a fish finder rig or a knocker rig, either works well. If you are fishing in shallow waters, you could use a jig and a shrimp slow retrieve sliding along the bottom. The flounder are aggressive feeders and they do have a mouth full of teeth and if you have some smaller pinfish they will eat them, too.

Another fish that would be found this time of year would be the hogfish. The hogfish are a bit more of a chore to find. They like the natural ledges in the 40 to 50 ft. range. And they only like to eat crustations, shrimp small crabs like fiddlers, etc. They will eat small blue crabs, too. I have witnessed them eating broken off legs from a spiny lobster while diving in the Keys. There is some good white meat on these guys that makes a great meal. And if you are looking for some fish for the table while you are looking in these areas there should be plenty of white grunts and lane snapper.

Check the regulations! Remember, I fish state waters for hire, only 9 miles offshore. So, if you fish inshore, there should be plenty of action, too. Red fish along the mangroves and around the edges of the oyster bars scattered all along the Southwest Florida coast. They are not too picky and they will eat dead stuff, as well as live bait. And remember, this time of year shrimp is naturally in the harbor and close to the beaches. The shrimp this time of year are larger than in the summer. Fishing on the flats, where there are grass beds, you can find some nice sea trout. They don't mind the cooler waters and like to hang out on the edges of the grass where they blend in. I have found that is a great ambush spot for the bigger trout.

So, if you are one of the newcomers to our area, I will come on your boat and help with your learning curve. I call these training sessions where I will help with where and how to rig your rods. And show you where you can drive your boat safely. This is where you and your best fishing buddy or your wife that you fish with can learn. By doing it this way, I can teach while we are fishing. A Story of EXTRAORDINARY COURAGE, STRENGTH, AND FAITH,

"I am witness to a thousand acts of compassion, sacrifice, and endurance. But of all the men whose dignity humbles me, one name is revered among all others. They took his life, but they could not take his dignity." "Lance Sijan prevails."-Senator John McCain, Faith of Our Fathers, Vietnam War, Fall of 1967.

The Ho Chi Minh Trail (main supply route from the North to fighters in the South and Cambodia) ran from a hub at Vinh southward to near the Mekong River and then the Vietnam-Cambodia border. A major mountain range (Annam Mountains) blocks ground travel from east-west directions. To get their supplies to the south, truck supply convoys had to cross one of two passes, Mu Gia, or Ban Karai, then a river ford at Ban Loboy in Laos. (Remember the recent article about heavily bombed Laos).

Now, in November of 1967, the amount of supplies going south rose by a large amount. In response, the U.S. doubled the bombing of the passes and the ford. These three places were very heavily defended by North Vietnamese forces. Lance Peter Sijan from Milwaukee, WI., after being an athlete in high school, went to a US Naval Academy Prep School. Graduating from the school he won an appointment to the U.S. Air Force Academy, where he played football, graduating in 1965. He went to pilot training, then to his first assignment at Da Nang Air Base, South Vietnam as an F-4 Phantom pilot. On the Ho Chi Minh Trail, the truck convoys moved mostly at night to avoid detection, so most of the attack sorties were at night. Lance was a rear seat pilot looking to soon upgrade to front seat as they took off as leader of a two-ship formation from Da Nang Air Base, South Vietnam at 8pm on November 9, his 67th combat mission. His squadron commander was in the front seat.

Within a half hour the they linked up with a Forward Air Controller, who dropped flares to illuminate the target, the Ban Loboy Ford. As they rolled in and dropped their bombs, Sijan's F-4 exploded (Analysis blamed a bad bomb fuse)! No parachutes were seen and no survival radios were heard. However, Captain Sijan did get out of the aircraft and landed on a mountain slope, falling through jungle trees, and passing out. He was unconscious with a compound fracture of his left leg, skull fracture, concussion, and a mangled right hand with his fingers bent backwards. His squadron commander, LtCol Armstrong has never been found and is presumed dead.

A search and rescue team of 108 total aircraft spent all the next day with Anti-Aircraft guns firing from all directions, searching without any contact, having nine of the rescue aircraft hit by ground fire and one A-1 lost. Finally, on November 11th, fighters from two bases heard Sijan on the radio. He was out of flares and hard to detect in the triple canopy jungle. One "Jolly Green" rescue helicopter got a close radio triangulation on him. Sijan told the crew to send a jungle penetrator but not a pararescue jumper due to heavy North Vietnamese Army patrols. Jolly hovered for 33 minutes until the enemy fire got too bad and had to leave. Nothing further was heard from him. Unbelievably, with his terrible injuries, and no food or water, Sijan crawled for 46 days, living off the jungle.

Thanks to the US bombing halt for Christmas, 1967, the north redoubled its supply effort again and were driving in daytime with no fear of being bombed. Because of that, they found Sijan in the middle of a road on Christmas Day. He was taken to a road camp near Ban Karai pass and put in a bamboo hut like you can see in our Military Heritage Museum. He was dressed in a black cotton shirt and pants with the left leg cut away due to the swelling. Several days later he noticed a mountain tribesman. Thinking he could escape and contact the tribesman, Lance overcame a guard, took him unconscious with a left-hand chop and crawled away. He was recaptured in half a day. Then his captors placed a full-length heavy cast on his left leg, not for medical purposes, but to keep him from escaping.

NOTE: The area of these passes and their heavy air defenses are very familiar to your author. My first combat mission in an RF-4 was in Mu Gia Pass, at night! Many more missions took me to those same places.



- 2. Defrost spinach 10 minutes on defrost setting in microwave then drain well by wringing out in dish towel. Defrost artichokes for 5-6 minutes on defrost in microwave then wring out and chop finely.
- 3. Heat a saucepan with butter over medium heat.
- 4. Add garlic to melted butter and stir 1 to 2 minutes, then sprinkle in flour and mix 1 minute more.
- 5. Whisk in stock and milk and season with salt, pepper and nutmeg.
- 6. Thicken for 1-2 minutes then remove from heat and melt in Gorgonzola.
- 7. Stir in spinach and artichokes and half of the shredded cheese.
- 8. Transfer to a small casserole and add remaining cheese to top.
- 9. Brown and bubble in the oven for 10-12 minutes.
- 10. Serve dip with warm bread, celery, or your favorite pita chips.



HOW TO MAKE A Miniature Garden IN A JAR

What You'll Need:

- A clear glass jar or container (like an old pickle jar or a fish bowl)
- Small plants (like succulents, moss, or tiny ferns)
- Potting soil
- Small pebbles or stones (for drainage)
- Activated charcoal (optional, helps keep the air fresh)
- Decorative items (like tiny figurines, shells, or colored stones)
- A spoon or small shovel (to help with planting)
- Water (for your plants)

No-Bake Oreo Cheesecake Bites

Oreo cookies *(or any chocolate cookies)* Cream cheese (softened) Powdered sugar Chocolate chips (optional)

Take your small plants and gently remove them from their pots. Make small holes in the soil and place each plant inside, patting the soil around the base to secure them. If you're using moss, just lay it on top of the soil.

Add Decorations:

Now, let your creativity shine! Place tiny figurines, shells, or colored stones around your plants to make your miniature garden unique.

Water Your Garden:

After planting, give your miniature garden a light watering. Be careful not to overwater; a few spritzes or a tablespoon or two of water will do!

The Places of Punta Gorda • BY REBECCA A. KEEN

Punta Gorda Charlotte Liprary

When I was a young girl, my family's move to a small town marked a new chapter. Relocating from a subdivision closer to the city, our country home felt more like my grandparents' farm than a place where I belonged. But soon, I would come to love the abundance of trees and thickets of blackberry vines.

The day we arrived, with boxes still unopened, I asked my mom if we could go to the library. I will never forget her response. She smiled and replied, "You think going to the library is a religious experience." It was true then and remains true today.

A late 19th-century philosopher, William James, once said that a religious experience is defined by a sense of wonder and involves the whole person . . . mind, emotions, values, and relationships – all things critical to my successful transition to a new high school! I'm thankful that my mom took me that afternoon. No matter what the coming days would bring, the library would provide a place of refuge where I could lose myself in a good book.

One of the very first places we explored when moving to Punta Gorda was our local library. Adorned with a painting depicting its 100+ year history, the mural called Pages from our Library's Past was dedicated the year after the building opened in 2019. The library had moved and expanded several times since 1908, when it was initially housed in the rectory of the Episcopal church. The location on Shreve Street has over 50,000 items available for checkout, with Youth, Teen, and Study spaces to relax and read to your heart's content. Self-service checkout and a drive-up drop box are options that simplify utilizing their services.

One of the most intriguing libraries I've ever heard of is The Haskell Free Library and Opera House, built in 1904 on the international border of the US and Canada. This architectural marvel boasts two different addresses, one in Vermont and the other in Quebec. It's been dubbed "the only library in the US without books." Recognized in the National Register of Historic Places for both countries, Haskell houses over 20,000 books published in French and English, all located on the Canadian side of the building. Stepping inside the US front door, visitors are greeted by a diagonal black line running through the building's reading room and opera house, marking the border. If you're fortunate enough to attend an opera, the performance takes place in Canada, but you might find yourself seated in the US!

While our community library may not be on an international border, the people of Punta Gorda have their own unique place to peruse. In a room dedicated to preserving our past, you will find books specifically focused on Florida's history. There is also a section for large-print books and new releases, as well as a section

for local authors. My new book, In the I of the Hurricane, Hope after Historic Storms Ian and Idalia, can be found in new releases by local authors. If you don't find the novel you are searching for, the library can request a transfer to obtain it. For the most popular selections, add yourself to the waiting list, and the library will notify you when it's available.

Having a community library is such a gift! If you have not already done so, stop by soon to unwrap this neighborhood treasure.

Pencil Cactus (Euphorbia Tirucalli)

The pencil cactus is a common plant found for sale at garden centers or from donated cuttings. They are succulents and exotic in form with pencil-width stems and tiny leaves. While succulents, they are not a true cactus. There is also a variety that produces a flush of red color on new stem growth and is referred to as Firesticks.

Like many succulents, pencil cactus will do best in very well-drained soil. Poorly drained areas will potentially promote root rot to develop. Full, all-day sun is also recommended for vigorous growth and best color. While pencil cactus can take the seasonal rains of summer, keep this succulent on the drier side during the winter when it is in a somewhat dormant state.

Be careful of the sap. Wear gloves when handling and especially when pruning and propagating. Propagate using six-inch tip cuttings which have been dried to seal off the cut end and prevent rot. The pencil cactus makes a beautiful specimen plant. While normal precautions must be exercised concerning its toxic sap, please consider it as a highly ornamental plant for your collection.

SPORTSMAN'S PARADISE

n the early days, Punta Gorda became known as a "Sportsman's Paradise". Tarpon was one of the most sought after game fish by those who navigated the expansive flats in our local waters. "Silver King" Tarpon, as they were called, with some weighing over 80 pounds were caught locally and at an impressive rate. Punta Gorda Isles, with its easy access to Charlotte Harbor, was the perfect pathway for avid anglers. Species like snook, sea trout, and redfish dotted the harbor and were relatively abundant and prime table fare for their captors. Boats and docks in the man-made canals of Punta Gorda Isles created the perfect habitat for snook and redfish, some of Florida's premiere game fish. Around the numerous channel markers. Cobia was a favorite catch.

Punta Gorda Isles, Inc. offered friends and prospective clients a unique opportunity to experience local waters first hand. The Islander, a 32-foot Chris Craft, was a busy vessel as sales in the Isles soared. Guests toured canals and Charlotte Harbor on The Islander, as Punta Gorda Isles sales representatives anticipated a sale. In 1962, 80 x 120 waterfront home sites in the Isles were selling for \$4,950. The Punta Gorda Isles "Boys" were forward-looking and original to include this type of selling point to attract buyers and it worked well. By 1970, there

were over 750 waterfront homes in the Isles. Later, the Islander II, a 48-foot Hatteras became part of the collection and it too hosted tours, parties and other celebrations. People from all over the country were interested in Punta Gorda for its small town atmosphere that offered luxury living at a more affordable price than in other parts of the state.

For my grandfather, a 22-pound snook became a favorite memory of fishing in the harbor just outside the canals of the Isles. Punta Gorda Isles made way for its residents to enjoy having boats in their backyards, access to both the harbor and the gulf, and a life on the water to enjoy year round. I remember diving through The Islander II as a teenager, after it was sunk somewhere in the waters near Ponce de Leon Park. As

I navigated my way through the vessel, I could almost imagine the many memories that went down with the boat. It was an uncanny but astonishing connection to the past; one that so many people were able to enjoy in its prime in such a special way.
