1	Duffy Health Center	<b>\$25</b> provides a Refresh Kit to an individual, including socks, underwear, t-shirt, sweatpants; <b>\$50</b> provides a Wellness Kit, which includes a Refresh kit AND a poncho, toiletry items, other needed items.		
2	Recovery without Walls	<b>\$20</b> provides an acupuncture session for a client; <b>\$30</b> provides a therapy session for a person in recovery.		
3	Fishing for the Mission 22	<b>\$30</b> helps fund our half-day fishing charter with equipment and materials; <b>\$55</b> funds a Massachusetts fishing license for a veteran.		
4	Falmouth Service Center	<b>\$25</b> purchases fresh milk, eggs, cheese and yogurt for three families for a week; <b>\$50</b> provides fish for ten families per week.		
5	Resilient Roots	<b>\$25</b> enables an under-resourced person to attend a workshop to learn how to grow their own food; <b>\$75</b> pays for a fruit tree to be planted at the home of an under-resourced person.		
6	Amplify POC Cape Cod	<b>\$20</b> helps support a business mentorship for an entrepreneur; <b>\$50</b> helps fund a spot at a vendor market.		
7	Cape Cod Foster Closet	<b>\$25</b> provides pajamas for a child in Foster Care; <b>\$60</b> will provide a pair of sneakers and socks to a child in Foster Care.		
8	Sharing Kindness	<b>\$25</b> enables a bereaved child to attend a peer grief group or a student to participate in Hope Squad, school-based suicide prevention; <b>\$50</b> helps to build the Healing House, a dedicated space for bereaved children and families.		
9	LINK of Cape Cod	<b>\$15</b> supports "Kids Teaching Kids," a 2024 event for Wampanoag children and young adults sharing their culture; <b>\$35</b> supports the 2024 speakers' series, Wampanoag educators raising awareness of their true history and culture.		
10	Hyde Square Task Force/Boston	<b>\$12</b> covers fee for an after-school theater, dance, or music lesson for underserved youth in Boston's Latin Quarter; <b>\$40</b> provides one-to-one mentoring and mental health support for underserved youth in Boston's Latin Quarter as they plan for college and the workforce.		
11	America's VetDogs/USA	<b>\$10</b> provides a bed for a puppy; <b>\$50</b> feeds one dog for two months.		
12	Jeremiah's Program	<b>\$25</b> offers seasonal gifts for families throughout the year including holidays, Mother's Day, graduation, and back to school; <b>\$75</b> provides five hours of childcare a week so moms can study, do their course work, and stay on track towards graduation.		
13	HandReach/Asia	<b>\$25</b> transportation from airport to lodging for a child in treatment and his/her guardian; <b>\$75</b> two days lodging for a child in treatment and his/her guardian.		
14	Syrian American Medical Society (SAMS)	<b>\$20</b> helps SAMS restock vital medications; <b>\$60</b> helps SAMS provide three medical services.		
15	Eden Reforestation Project/Worldwide	<b>\$30</b> plants forty (40) trees; <b>\$75</b> plants one hundred (100) trees.		
16	Bikes for the World	<b>\$25</b> for bicycle collected, compacted, and delivered to qualified non-profit partner; <b>\$75</b> bike maintenance kit for cyclists, including spare tire, multi-tool, and basic pump.		
17	Givat Haviva/Israel	<b>\$25</b> funds food for one participant in our overnight encounter program; <b>\$70</b> enables a student to participate in a one-day encounter program at our Jewish and Arab Center for Peace.		
18	Newton/San Juan del Sur (Nicaragua)	<b>\$40</b> for each Ecostove with chimney, including materials, transportation and coordinator salary; <b>\$60</b> pays tuition for a student for one year.		
19	Revived Soldiers/Ukraine	<b>\$25</b> supports medical treatment in the U.S. for wounded soldiers; <b>\$60</b> supports building and fitting a prosthetic limb for a wounded soldier.		
20	Maya Childcare/Guatemala	<b>\$20</b> provides safe drinking water for the Center for one month; <b>\$50</b> provides books and art supplies for the Center for one month.
