Anyone presenting with symptoms or a positive LFT: New continuous cough High temperature Loss of taste/smell	ALL	High	 If symptoms are noticed in school, the person will be sent home straight away If a pupil is awaiting collection, they should be left in a room on their own if possible and safe to do so. A window should be opened for fresh air ventilation if possible. Appropriate PPE should also be used if close contact is necessary. Further information on this can be found in the use of PPE in education, childcare and children's social care settings guidance. Any rooms they use should be cleaned after they have left. The household (including any siblings) should follow the PHE stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus (COVID-19) infection. PCR Test and isolate until results if you are an unvaccinated adult. (Children and fully vaccinated adults need not isolate, but test daily for 7 days) If the result is positive, they should isolate for 10 days from symptoms or the PCR if asymptomatic; although his can be reduced to 7 days if there are two negative LFTs on day 6 and day 7 A close contact is face-to-face for 15 minutes, within 2m; therefore, we would advise that the child's table group daily LFT for 7 days Siblings can still attend school, but need to LFT for 7 days 	Mid

			 Other subjects - 'bingo' grid, with the expectation that at least two other subjects are completed each day on top of PE, Maths and English. Action SLT to set the expectation (through a Zoom conference with the class / school) that all children are completing Maths, English, PE and at least two other subjects daily; with a view that they cover all subjects in a two-week cycle. Action SLT to ensure that those who did not engage during lockdown are fully aware that they have to engage. Answers to maths and comprehension questions will be sent to parents. Photographs of work done should be uploaded by 7pm on the day completed, to be reviewed by the teachers the following day. Feedback, in the form of praise and questions to be given in a timely manner, which the children should respond to. Close contacts with no symptoms to take daily LFTs for 7 days; no one need isolate unless they are unvaccinated or are symptomatic. Where there are too many absences to maintain safety – partial or complete closure for certain classes or part time / AM / PM classes may be necessary. UNWELL TEACHER: TAs may be asked to set work for classes in the event of staff shortages whereby the teacher is unwell. 			 In the event of more than one member of staff being off ill in a paired year group, the class will be closed and children will be directed to WhiteRose and Oak Academy and their responses on Class Dojo will be monitored by the support team. NB: Reception is a single class, therefore if Miss Dalton is off, Tapestry will be managed by the Support Team. WELL TEACHER: The teacher should continue to plan, prepare, Zoom, call and upload work to Class Dojo / Tapestry if they have covid, and are asymptomatic / feel well.
