CHRISTMAS DOG TREATS!

- 2 cups pumpkin or cooked sweet potato
- 1 egg
- 1/2 cup oats
- 3 cups of flour
- 3 Tbsp of all natural peanut butter
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon



Preheat Oven: 350 Degrees F

Mix dry ingredients first then add wet ingredients. Mix until it forms into a dough. Place on a floured surface, roll out 1/4 - 1/8 in. thick and cut into shapes with your favorite Christmas cookie cutters.

Place onto a greased cookie sheet and cook for 30-35 min until golden brown. Place on a cooling rack to cool and harden. Enjoy!
